IS IT ILLEGAL TO BURN A FLAG? By The Flag Man

Prior to 1989, YES. There were criminal penalties for certain acts of desecration or for knowingly burning, mutilating, defacing, trampling or maintaining on the floor any United States flag.

The Supreme Court decision in *Texas vs. Johnson* in 1989 held the statute unconstitutional. This statute was amended but was ultimately struck down in 1990 by the Supreme Court decision in *United States vs. Eichman* as protected First Amendment speech.

Congress has yet to agree upon a constitutional amendment on this subject.

Wow, we have had a great attendance at the last couple events. Let's start with the *Welcome to Golf Knolls* sign and Francine Hill Library Dedication Ceremonies. We had about 90 people in attendance. Don Fortney and friends did an outstanding job organizing the event. We were hoping to attract new residents but missed our mark. (We did have a couple new folks attend.)

Our compliance with the Americans with Disabilities Act is in its third year. I have fulfilled my obligation as Director. All other improvements will have to wait as we are trying to be conservative in our spending. The only two improvements not made this year were the assisted door openers for the Meeting and Library rooms. Hopefully, these projects will be completed by next year's board of directors.

I am looking for a tall bar stool type chair that has a back to it for our new desk in the library. If you have one just gathering dust and would like to donate it we could surely use it.

Attention grandparents of toddlers and young children—check out the new children's shelf in the library. Come borrow a picture book that you can read to your grandchildren. While you're there, check out all the puzzles and the eclectic book collection.

The ACC team has been working with many Lot Owners, sending gentle reminders to clean their front yards. We are focusing on vegetation that is taller than the roof and carport edges, dead bushes, weeds, and of course, palm fronds. Don't forget, all homes must have at least five live plants in the front yard and all bushes that front the road must be maintained at 3 feet or lower, so a driver's visibility is not impaired. Thank you for those of you that keep your home and landscape in an excellent condition.



FACILITIES UPDATE By Pat Pipher

General Maintenance:

Outdoor Spa: The outdoor spa continues to be a big topic of conversation. Last month we outlined some of the challenges, and this month, I am happy to say, we are at the finish line. The spa has all-new plumbing, tile work and a non-skid pebble surface which has a longer lifetime than a plaster finish. It is also much safer. As of this writing, all that remains is to acid wash and refill with fresh water and turn on the pumps.

Typically, the heat to the outdoor spa is turned off in early November as a cost-saving measure. This year we will leave it heated into mid-December, weather-permitting.

Keys: Locks and Board Directors, Committee Boards and other volunteers with special duties were issued keys to their areas. Over the years we have collected a variety of keys, many of which don't fit any current locks. The GKA Board is in the process of taking an inventory of everyone who has keys to the facility and a list of who needs keys and to what buildings, offices, etc. We will then change the door locks as necessary and re-issue new keys. We will also maintain a log for those signing out keys and signing in keys when their duties are finished.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM By Mick Herod







Last month, Spring Knolls hosted a seminar called *Firewise*. They invited a very informative panel from Murrieta Fire and Rescue, CalFire, Firewise and others. Most of the panel was made up of heads of these organizations, so there was a lot of valuable information from these participants. Firewise is a local program for communities smaller than 2,500 homes. Watch for more information about this important program.

Excerpts from the *City of Murrieta Fire and Rescue* press release:

"Murrieta, CA - Murrieta Fire & Rescue (MFR) is proud to announce that the California Board of Forestry and Fire Protection has designated the City of Murrieta as a Fire Risk Reduction Community. critical This designation recognizes MFR's ongoing commitment to wildfire preparedness and mitigation efforts within the City of Murrieta. When the list [went] into effect on July 1, 2024, Murrieta [was] one of only 11 cities statewide and the sole fire agency in Riverside County to receive this designation, and it is valid for two years.

Earning the Fire Risk Reduction Community designation brings significant Residents and businesses should see reductions in future insurance premiums as the California Department of Insurance has mandated insurance providers recognize this designation community-level as mitigation that must be reflected in the rate offered. (Title 10, § 2644.9(d)). Additionally, the city will gain access to increased grant opportunities for fire mitigation projects, such as fuel reduction and public education initiatives. Furthermore, the designation allows MFR to develop and implement targeted fire safety programs, fostering a more prepared community. Overall, this recognition brings heightened awareness to the importance of individual responsibility in wildfire prevention efforts."

assignment over the course of about 10 days. For those who want to help, please call me at your convenience so we can discuss our residents' needs and get you back on our list. I would appreciate your assistance! Also, for some reason, some volunteers withdrawn because they work, take vacations or have other things going on in their lives. This is normal. As I have written before, if you are on our list of volunteers, text me at the number below. Let me know on a Saturday or Sunday what days you will not be available the next week. You do NOT have to give me a reason, just text the day or days you will not be available. That will help us when the Directors are looking for volunteers to help.

Thank you for your help. We have a great community, but as our senior residents get older, their issues and needs change. Our program is to make your life better and easier to handle. At some point every one of us will need some help. "Let it begin with us."

Get ready to put on your ugly sweater and support the VMHS Band.



CURBSIDE INSPECTION GUIDELINES By ACC Team

Structural:

Window screens in good working order

Roof fascia board - both wood & paint in good shape

Exterior house siding in good shape

Fences: in good shape - painted

Crawl Space Cover in good, sealed condition

Home foundation vent covers intact

<u>Landscape</u>: Bushes should be shaped, below windows

No dropped fruit on ground

No weeds in front yard

Bushes along driveway no more than 3' high to avoid visual hazard

Decorative rock evenly spread with no voids Must have 5 living plants facing the street

No more than 5 statues in good condition in front yard

<u>ADA compliance</u>: Ramps must be ADA-compliant

Handrails - sturdy, good working order

Tall trees: Remove dead palm fronds

Italian Cypress - no higher than roof edge

Large tree canopy not to extend beyond property boundary, e.g., neighbor's fence or past curb onto street

<u>Mailbox tube</u>: Tube secure - clear of all debris <u>Mailbox</u>: Upright - good working order

Trash barrels stored from street view behind front of house

<u>Carports</u>: No personal or household items stored in sight


