WHAT'S NEWS? By Mick Herod

The HOA Board Election Process for 2026 has begun. You should have received a notice, as well as a Candidate Nomination Form. This can be used for self-nomination, or to nominate another resident (who must be an owner)...just ask them if they are willing to serve, if elected, before submitting their nomination. Election Rules prohibit spouses from serving jointly on the Board. All Nomination Forms MUST be received by the GKA Office NO LATER THAN 5:00pm on Thursday, October 16. Late nominations will NOT be accepted.

Nominees will be vetted by the Inspector of Elections no later than Monday, October 20. If a Nominee is disallowed by the Election Rules, that Nominee will have the option to request a Individual Dispute Resolution meeting (IDR) on or before Tuesday, November 4.

A pre-ballot notice of vetted Candidates will be distributed on Wednesday, November 5

Road construction is continuing with the widening of Murrieta Hot Springs Road to three lanes, from Margarita Rd. to Winchester Rd. Pay close attention to all road signs describing the lane closures and watch for those who are always in a hurry and will wait until the last possible second to cut in front of you because their lane "suddenly ended." Or, better yet, avoid the construction zone altogether.

Welcome to fall and the month of October, the start of the busy season for many of us.

All owners should have received GKA Board of Directors' nomination forms on or before the 16th of September in their tubes or via mail. You can nominate yourself or another person. All nominees should be willing to work in any position on the board if elected. Those wishing to serve on the board should want to do what is best for our community and not serve with a personal agenda. All nominations must be returned to the GKA office on or before 5:00 pm October 16th, 2025, marked to the attention of the Inspector of Elections.

When and if you receive an ACC violation at your home, there are simple ways you can manage it. You can appeal it, you can rectify the violation, or you can let it go to fines. Everyone has a 30-day window to rectify or appeal. When it goes to fines it is too late. The ACC team is willing to collaborate with you and would rather the violation not go to fines.

I had a talk with our pool man regarding algae in the outdoor spa and the temperature set in the 90's. He advised me that since GKA does not have a self-chlorinating system, having the temperature set at 102 degrees on the hot days we have had lower chlorine levels. Keeping the temperature in the 90's does retain some chlorine, but not a correct level. He services the pool and spa twice a week and does the best he can with an old system.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL REPORT By Jane Recht

I hope this message finds everyone in good health and spirits. I understand that our busy schedules can sometimes lead to important matters being unintentionally overlooked. The Curbside Notification form issued by the ACC serves as a reminder of the commitments we each agreed to upon purchasing our homes in GKA.

Please note that the Articles and Sections of the CC&Rs, which form the basis of our community regulations, were updated in March 2025 to align with new management procedures. As of September, 2025, additional revisions have been made to reflect recent changes concerning our fining process.

In accordance with new state legislation, specifically Governor Newsom's amendment to HOA law through California's AB 130, 30. effective June 2025. homeowner association fines are now capped at \$100 per violation, except for cases involving health and safety concerns. This law also ensures that homeowners are given an opportunity to resolve violations prior to the imposition of fines or disciplinary actions. Consequently, our CC&Rs have been further revised to ensure compliance with this legislation.

You will receive the newly-revised Fine Regulations and ACC Guidelines in your tube. We recognize this is the second revision within the year but this is due to legislative updates. Under the previous process, fines accumulated at \$25 per day with an annual maximum of \$1,250. The new structure sets fines at \$100 for each instance of noncompliance, renewable if issues remain unresolved, following the latest board -approved procedural guidelines.

Finally, my term as ACC Chairperson will conclude soon, and nominations for the GKA Board election are now open. Your participation is essential—active involvement can help us avoid the need to hire an external management company, which would significantly increase HOA dues. STREETS AND SAFETY By Brian Chute

The City of Murrieta Fire Marshall recently communicated to Golf Knolls about the importance of having visible address numbering on our homes. Having clearly visible, accurate address numbers on homes is a critical public safety measure — and there are several strong reasons why it matters, especially for emergency personnel:

Faster Emergency Response

Clear, visible numbers help police, fire, and paramedics find the right home quickly — every second counts in an emergency.

Fire & Disaster Safety

Well-marked addresses let firefighters and utility crews act fast, reducing damage and risk.

Police & Security

Good numbering avoids delays, confusion, and mistaken stops during urgent calls.

Signs of the times. The City of Murrieta's regulations concerning garage sale signs, estate sale sign, and others are as follows:

No signage is allowed to be placed on any utility poles, stop signs, landscape areas, mailboxes, or on public property. Once the garage sale is over, all remaining items must be stored or discarded properly and placed out of Public View. (Ord. 551 § 4, 2019; Ord. 105 § 1 (part), 1993: Ord. 3 § 1 (part), 1991: prior code § 6.04.030)

While it's just my anecdotal observation, more vehicles appear to be slowing down and stopping at intersections. Thank you to residents for keeping our community safe by following the rules of the road.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM By Mick Herod









The device shown above is a CAT (Combat Action Tourniquet), used by the US military to control bleeding from an injured limb. This device, used properly, can literally save your life by eliminating blood loss resulting from a major injury.

Each ERT member is being given a CAT tourniquet, to assist residents in an emergency.

Purchases of these devices and other tools (such as two-way radios, utility shutoff tools and First Aid kits) are made possible by your generous donations of **CA CRV** plastic bottles and aluminum cans. The ERT redeems these items locally for cash, at least once a month. This cash is turned in to the GKA Office and deposited into the ERT account for current and future expenses.


If possible, it streamlines the redemption process if you can sort plastic bottles and aluminum cans into separate bags. Also, NO GLASS, please. Glass should be put in your blue recycle bin. Glass can easily be broken and puncture a trash bag, greatly increasing the potential for injury to those who are handling the bags for storage or transport.

Our redemption center accepts bottle caps, but ONLY if attached to a plastic bottle. Please, no loose caps.

Plastic bottles of any size, as long as they have the **CA CRV** designation, are accepted. This includes plastic juice bottles but *not* milk containers, as there is no deposit collected for milk.

If you're new to GKA, there is a Recycle Area located between the center gate and the Banquet Room. Just drop off your bags anytime you're in the area.

THANK YOU again for helping the ERT to obtain items that can make a difference in a park-wide emergency.

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LOOKING UP IN OCTOBER

The first full moon of the month (Hunters Moon), which is also a Supermoon, will be on Monday, October 6. What's a Supermoon? That's when the Moon appears larger and brighter than regular full moons because the Moon is at its closest point to Earth. This is one of eight Supermoons in 2025, with the next two occurring on November 5 and December 4th.

You'll have two chances to see meteor showers this month, on October 7 (Draconids) and October 21 (Orionids), the latter being the best chance to spot meteors as the New Moon won't be visible, with up to 20 meteors per hour.

To view the International Space Station flying over, the best date is Wednesday, October 1. Look south-southwest at 7:29pm. Flyover is expected to last about six minutes.
