
- You are responsible to keep the street area and gutters in front of your lot clean of debris and swept up.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM By Mick Herod

SAFETY AND IFNORMATION FAIR:

Our planned Safety and Information Fair had to be rescheduled from last month to Saturday, July 13. Hours and location remain the same, 3:00pm to 4:30pm in the Banquet Room. Please see the flyer that was distributed, announcing the new date.

We're expecting a large number of vendors, who will be stationed at various tables in the Banquet Room. Move around at your own pace. There will be no formal presentations, but lots of detailed information regarding emergency preparation. Admission is FREE and there are FREE handouts available.

You will also have the opportunity to purchase raffle tickets for some really great Grand Prizes. Tickets can be purchased for \$5, but YOU decide which items you want to win. Winners will NOT need to be present. We will have two 'live' drawings throughout the Fair and one final drawing before the Fair closes. Winners will also be announced at the BBQ (which opens a half-hour earlier at 4pm on this day only).

CALLE DE AMOR AUTOMATIC GATES:

To help improve response time for Fire and EMT equipment, the ERT has received approval to motorize the padlocked gates at the end of the Calle de Amor cul-de-sac. This will now allow access to Golf Knolls directly from Hunter Road, vs. the many speed bumps that their equipment must currently navigate. These gates will NOT be open to residents or the public. They will only open upon arrival of emergency equipment using an Opticom strobe. This is the device on emergency equipment that turns traffic lights to green, in the direction that the equipment is traveling. We do not vet know which Fire Station(s) will use this new entrance, but the City of Murrieta is planning on constructing a new Fire Station (#6) along Clinton Keith Road near the intersection with Winchester Road (Murrieta Capital Improvement Project 21033).

The gate conversion is now complete and fully operational! Thanks to our Murrieta Council Member, Cindy Warren, and Supervisor Chuck Washington's office for making this happen.

BEWARE OF PHONE SCAMS

Most of us have Caller ID on our phones, showing the name of the person or organization that is calling. Spoofing is when a scammer uses a legitimate-looking Caller ID, to make it appear they're calling from a real source. They may be calling from a random financial institution (where you may or may not have an account), the IRS or perhaps Social Security.

They may tell you that your account has been compromised, and attempt to get you to divulge private information (such as account numbers, logins or passwords). They often convey a sense of urgency. DON'T TAKE THE BAIT! You should simply hang up. If you're not comfortable doing so, you can also tell the caller that you are in the middle of something, and ask for their phone number so that you can call them back. Chances are very likely they won't give you their number,

and you'll never hear from them again.


Other scam artists may pretend to be *Tech* Support from Microsoft or Apple. They will tell you that your computer is infected with a virus and ask you to give them access to your computer so that they can remove the virus. Unless YOU initiated the call to a legitimate *Tech Support* person, NEVER give a stranger access to your computer. If it didn't have a virus before, it most certainly will be infected before the "Tech Support" person is finished.

You will often have to a pay a ransom to get back your data. Any money that you've paid to scammers will likely never be seen again.

Some scammers will tell you have won a prize, but you must pay a "processing fee" to redeem it.

Others may pretend to be from UPS, Fedex or Amazon, saying they can't deliver your package without payment of a fee. DON'T BITE!
