advertised on TV. You know, the ones where people unexpectedly learn they were part this or part that and had no idea about either.

A few weeks after sending my DNA in, I learned the results. And, because it's March, I'll let you know that while I'm a small fraction Norwegian, I'm almost 100% Irish! Who knew?

But that was just the beginning. Boy was it!

Soon after receiving those results, a distant relative on my biological parents' side contacted me. He also had taken a DNA test and had been alerted that ours matched. I told him about my family search, and he knew exactly who I was seeking. After a few calls, he sent me the name and phone number of one of five brothers I never knew I had! After being raised as an only child, this news was mind blowing.

I really couldn't believe it, but gradually after some extensive research, I learned it was all true. I contacted my "brother," told him who had contacted me and he was just as excited as I was to meet his only sister and talk to me about his, and my, deceased parents, who had never told him about me.

He's living in Wisconsin, and we've talked for hours through Skype. He sent me photos of my parents and brothers. We hope to someday meet in person.

I bring this all up, not just because I've learned about my Irish

heritage but also because that experience reinforced, in some ways, how I feel about Spring Knolls. Since moving here on March 13, 2015, I've met many people who I never knew existed. They come from all backgrounds, heritages, and places. I suspect there are even some who are part Irish!

Many have served on your Board of Directors or are serving on it now. Our new board is made up of individuals with diverse backgrounds, education and experience which we each bring with us to enrich the whole board as a unit.

Like I am with my new brother, we're learning about each other, capturing and focusing on our strengths and learning how our different personalities can work in harmony for all residents. Such harmony is not only our goal, but has been the board's standard for the nearly two years I've been honored to serve as president. Pardon the contemporary cliché, teamwork is our DNA.

That being said, as fellow residents you're part of a much bigger team. We 9, together with you, are more than 400 people strong. Your volunteer Board depends on you to help us, by reporting things that need attention to us or to the police, lending a hand if you can or even just sending out some encouraging words from time to time.

Your board members will be at the March 12 open house to take your questions, get to know you better, or meet for the first time.

With that, I leave you with an old Irish blessing:

The response from residents has been great this year.

As of mid-February, there were only about 90 state-required resident forms yet to be turned in to the Spring Knolls office. That means about 75% came in by the deadline.

If you have not yet submitted your form, please do as soon as possible. Remember, \$50-a-month late fines apply after Jan. 31. If you have misplaced your **neon-green** form that was sent to each homeowner in December, you can find extra blank copies in a document container just outside the Association office.

COMMUNITY GARAGE SALE: The annual tri-unit Community Garage Sale will be held Saturday, April 23 in Spring Knolls, Warm Spring Knolls and Golf Knolls. Those wishing to sell items may do so on that day without obtaining advance approval from the Spring Knolls Board.

Advance approval is needed in Spring Knolls, however, if you wish to hold a garage, estate or moving sale any other time. Applications are available in a clearly marked document holder outside the Unit 1 office.

NO TUBE? NO GOOD. HOA rules require every household to have an outside information tube near their mailboxes. Most Spring Knolls homes have one, but about 50 do not. It is illegal to leave such materials in your mailboxes. If you need an information tube where flyers, monthly Spring Knolls News and other key information is placed, please contact the office.



THAT TIME AGAIN:

The days will seem longer, except on March 13, when Daylight Savings Time makes its annual visit. So, Spring forward one hour. The fire department also recommends that you check your smoke alarm batteries at this time and change them if necessary. Although March 13 will be only 23 hours, that chore shouldn’t take long.

Message clear, walkie talkies are here!

We received the 20 walkie-talkies we ordered for Area Coordinators. Holli and I tested them throughout SKA, and were pleasantly surprised I could hear her wherever I went, although some areas had static.

The idea is to give one to each AC and network from one to another. They worked well, and each cost less than \$12!

Cindy Woody, Holli and I talked about having an open house, rather than an Emergency Preparedness Fair, since we've been "isolated" for some time. We thought it would be a good idea to involve other Spring Knolls groups, as none have been very active either. The SK board passed it unanimously! This will have (most importantly) a free BBQ lunch and ice cream social for SKA residents, put on by the Boosters, as well as tables from the

other clubs and groups in SKA-SKERT (including the medical team), Cindy's "In the Know in SK", Senior Advocates, Boosters, Library, Newcomers Committee, as well as Board responsibilities- Common Grounds, Architectural, Compliance and Residency. SKERT won an Earthquake Country Alliance award, which consists of Map Your Neighborhood fliers (which Area Coordinators will use for meetings in their territory) and furniture straps to secure your bookcases, china cabinets, TV sets and other items.

Beware of bobcats ... and solicitors!

As of this writing, February has been a fairly quiet month for our blasts. Our wildlife sightings have slowed down tremendously.

I still hear of bobcat sightings around properties bordering the Bible College but the coyote sightings have dropped way off.

We've had a few reports of solicitors in our area but a team of people work at keeping them out when we hear of it. You can tell them no soliciting is allowed in our area or you

can call the police.

Sometimes people get in and we don't know it. These outside companies should ONLY be coming to your house if you have made an appointment with them. There may be times when a Spring Knolls person comes to

your door but they should have a name tag or at least identify themselves as being with our community.

Remember, if you see something say something. That does require you to first call the police, then letting us know. We can't report, as we're not actually witness to happenings. I can tell you that if you report something the police will not do anything to make people suspect you were the caller. If you're afraid tell them that as well. Murrieta police are very good at responding and want us to call them.

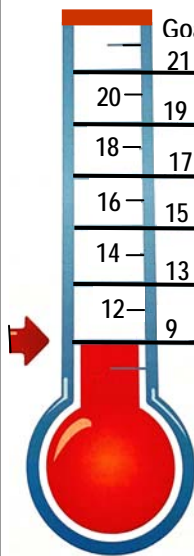
Area Coordinator Corner
