NEW BOARD OF DIRECTORS. The existing Board of Directors will continue to serve until the Annual Open Meeting on Monday, January 13, 2025. The changeover process is described in more detail on Page 8.

RECENT CHANGES TO 2024 BOARD. We welcome Jerry Dyer, appointed as our new Architectural Control Director. Jane Recht is now Secretary and Hilary Wylie is now the Streets/Safety/Signs Director.

<u>DIRECTORS RETIRING</u>. Alan Maretsky retired from the Board earlier this year. At the upcoming Annual Open Meeting on January 13, 2025, Pat Pipher, Hilary Wylie, Roger Marceau and Jane Recht will retire as the new Board takes office. We thank them all for their dedication and service.

HOA DUES ARE **DECREASING** FOR 2025! As announced at the November General Meeting, for those paying annually, dues are decreasing to \$1,020. Semi-annual dues will be \$510 plus service fee and quarterly dues will be \$255 plus service fee.

SOME RESIDENTS WILL RECEIVE A CREDIT ON THEIR 2025 HOA ANNUAL STATEMENT. If you paid your 2024 dues in full in January, 2024, you will be receiving a CREDIT on your 2025 statement to offset the full-year Waste Management fees that you paid to the HOA. For those who paid dues quarterly or semi-annually, those credits were already deducted from your payments due.



At times a written warning may be left, listing certain violations that need to be corrected. Failure to do so will cause more written warnings and then a formal letter advising that if violations are not corrected by a certain date, fines can be levied against the homeowner. Please don't ignore prior warnings. If you have a problem correcting the violation, let us know. We will do our best to work with you.

Reminder to all that political signage and flags in your yards and attached to your homes, were to have been removed by November 20th.

I must say that this is and was the most challenging job for no pay...all zeroes on the "check."


I can only recommend that you attend the next Board Meeting on Monday, December 9th to hear of all the projects completed this year.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM By Mick Herod







The ERT has been stocking up on equipment that will be beneficial in an emergency. This includes First Aid tents, First Aid supplies, splints, solar-charged lanterns, solar AM/FM/weather band radios, propane tanks and camping stoves and emergency generators. The list goes on and on, and we continually add to our inventory for use in a park-wide emergency.

We're able to provide this equipment in part because of the money received from bottles and cans that you contribute and we recycle each month. (If you're new to Golf Knolls, we have a collection area inside the gates, just behind the Banquet Room.) Every penny collected goes into the ERT fund, so that we can purchase needed items. We accept all plastic bottles and aluminum cans with CA CRV on the container, but NO GLASS, please.

But did you know that we can also assist in personal emergencies? We have a varied stock of personal mobility aids in the Haven Room, located at the Recreation Center. These items include walkers, Rollators (4-wheel walkers with seats), wheelchairs, potty chairs and shower chairs (some with backrests), and a few other specialty items. Any of these items are available for short-term loan. Accidents and injuries happen. If you need to borrow any of these items, contact me at the phone number shown on Page 2 and we can arrange a pickup or delivery.

The majority of this gently-used equipment is donated by you, the residents of Golf Knolls. If you have such items you'd like to donate, please leave me a phone message.

Once the new President is seated, she will step down as a Director.

The new Board will determine amongst themselves which position each Director will fill. If two or more Directors are vying for a particular position (including the President), the new Board (not the residents) will conduct a secret vote (administered by the Director of Elections). The voting for each contested position will continue until there is a majority vote for that position.

MARINE CORPS TOYS FOR TOTS ANNUAL DRIVE AT GKA TOYS FOR TOTS Drop-Off


