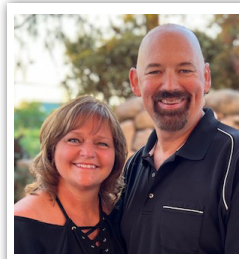

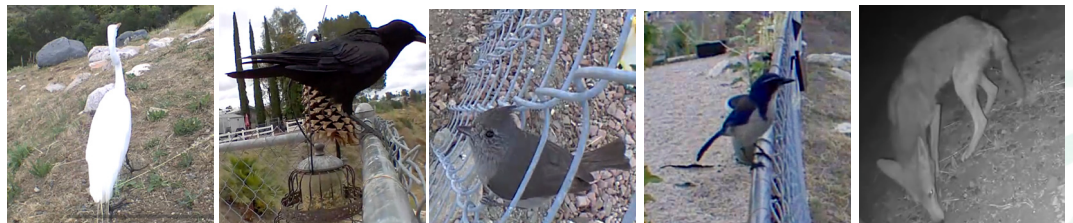

WELCOME COMMITTEE - Terry Quinn and Joanne Marsh

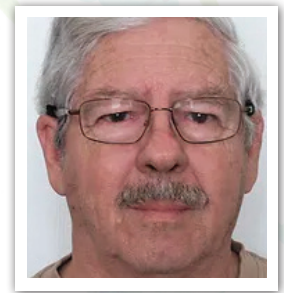


It's really wonderful being on the Welcome Committee because we get to meet all of our new residents first. This month we have 4 wonderful people who joined us for the Bar-B-Q.

ON APPFOLIO PORTAL:
WHY NOT?

- If you are on the Portal, you can find your account info directly by logging into your portal. You can even make a payment, look at your payment history, change your password, phone number, and more.
- LATE FEES: Did you know that the HOA can charge you late fees? Yes, we can; it is in the Bylaws and CC&R's and is authorized by law. There is also a possibility that if you are late, you will be charged interest on the balance and an administrative fee. All of this is very costly and frustrating to you the homeowner and to us. The HOA does not want or need to make money from late fees. Late fees can be avoided by setting up your Portal and Autopay. You can also pay manually with the Portal, if you don't like Autopay.
- I don't have a computer or email; how can I set up my Portal? Yes, even in this day and age of computers, there are some who have not bought into the computer fad. There are even some who do not have a cell phone, "Oh my". The HOA can still help you set up a Portal and Autopay. BUT, if you still want to work in the world of paper checks; make sure you make your payment 10 days before the 15th to avoid late fees. And by the way, if you are using your bank "Bill Pay", that is a paper check.
- Security: Did you know that paper checks are very high risk relative to Direct Deposit (ACH). That is why Social Security pays directly to your bank. Your account and routing number are on your check. Checks get misdelivered all the time, and they may be delivered late... "late fee".
- Renting Your House? Rental Approval Request Forms are required by the HOA to be submitted prior to renting to avoid fines. Let us know if you need one!

VICE PRESIDENT - Rick Martinez



As promised, Henry and I went around the community in May and discovered most of our neighbors are doing a fantastic job keeping up with the yards. The flower beds are in bloom, bushes and trees were trimmed, and the

weeds were under control. However, I did discover a few homes out of compliance and for those properties we sent out First Notices. What that means is, if you ever receive this type of notice, you must get your property in compliance within the specified time, normally 30 days from receipt of the notice. I would like to note that for those properties cited most are already in compliance, and for those that have not come into compliance is because there is a third party involved or the property is currently vacant. We are still working with those homeowners and/or responsible parties to get those yards in compliance.

Another item we discovered is that there are some homes that back up to a berm or hillside and the weeds in these areas are out of control. The problem exists because this is a very difficult location to get to the weeds and in some cases the homeowner does not realize that they have the burden of maintaining this area. Some believe that it is the responsibility of the HOA, and in some cases, it is, but not in all. So, if you have such a property and are not sure if you are responsible for the maintenance, please contact me or Henry and we will come out and assess the area. Also, if you are in need of help you can contact Louie's Maintenance at 951-447-3985. He is a local resident and will help you with the weeds at a very affordable price.

I would like to share a couple more things about my early years and then tell you about my wife's and I's Summer vacation. I will try to make this brief because I can be long-winded at times. After my failed attempts to leave the house, I decided to do as I was told and work with my dad in the family business. He owned a trucking company, and it was always his dream to have his sons work

Flag Day - In 1916, President Woodrow Wilson issued a proclamation that officially established June 14 as Flag Day; on August 3, 1949, National Flag Day was established by an Act of Congress. Flag Day is not an official federal holiday.

Flag Day is observed on June 14 to honor and commemorate the adoption of the American flag which occurred on this day in 1777 by the Second Continental Congress.

The United States Army also celebrates its birthday on this day. U.S. Flag Day is not a federal holiday. However, the U.S. celebrates the day with parades that draw thousands of spectators from all over the U.S. and also different countries around the world. Americans display their country's flag in front of their homes to celebrate this day. Fly your flag proudly because of our freedom!!

Fathers Day - The campaign to celebrate the nation's fathers did not meet with the same enthusiasm—perhaps because, as one florist explained, “fathers haven't the same sentimental appeal that mothers have.” Slowly, the holiday spread. In 1916, President Wilson honored the day by using telegraph signals to unfurl a flag in Spokane when he pressed a button in Washington DC In 1924, President Calvin Coolidge urged state governments to observe Father's Day.

The nation's first Father's Day was celebrated on June 19, 1910, in the state of Washington. However, it was not until 1972—58 years after President Woodrow Wilson made Mother's Day official—that the day honoring fathers became a nationwide holiday in the United States. 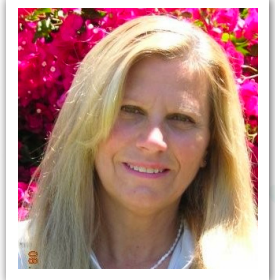

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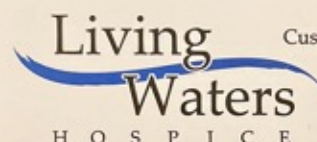
