BITS AND PIECES From around the Community

The job of converting the padlocked gate on Calle de Amor to a motorized gate is now complete (ahead of schedule)! There is no longer a chain or padlock on the gate. Fire, Paramedics and Police can now utilize this entrance from or to Hunter Road. See the Emergency Response Team article on Page 5 for more details.

Pool and spa rules have been revised and are in effect. Take note that <u>children under 18</u> are only allowed in the pool from 10am to 1pm daily and are prohibited from using the spas. See inside for the latest updates.

Several new ceiling fans have been installed in the Banquet Room, to improve air circulation, and they work great!

Meeting Room chairs are scheduled to be replaced in 2025. Budget funds were reallocated to the Library relocation/remodel.

Relocation of the Library is in process, moving from the current area (inside the office foyer) to the former ping-pong room. This will allow full ADA (wheelchair) access.

The July 4 Cart Parade was well-attended; over 50 participants cruised the streets in their decorated golf carts, on e-bikes, bicycles and even power chairs. Afterwards, we enjoyed 115 stadium dogs and root beer floats inside the Banquet Room.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT By Pat Pipher

BOARD UPDATES:

The Board is doing a little reorganization. VICKI DAVIS moves to Vice President. She will handle collections. violations and escrow: JANE RECHT moves to ACC which includes ADA issues; ALAN MARETSKY, a new Director, covers Streets, Safety and Signs Director, another new JUDY and KIRKPATRICK, takes over Landscaping. Of course, the other positions stay the same as listed in this newsletter. YOUR BOARD OF DIRECTORS HAS ONE MORE SLOT TO **FILL**. With Jane moving to another position, it leaves the Secretary position open. Jane and I will split the duties until we can fill that position. MY URGENT APPEAL IS TO GET **INVOLVED - JOIN THE BOARD**. If we cannot fill these positions, then you're looking at a management company to shoulder some of the work. None of us want that. Please call me if you want more information.

TRASH CANS:

The Board announced that with the changes with Waste Mgmt., we would be lenient on stowing the cans out of sight. That means you need to make every effort to stow the cans in a garage, the rear part of a carport or along the side of your home, **DO NOT LEAVE THEM ON THE STREET OR IN THE FRONT YARD OR IN AN AREA IN FRONT OF THE HOME.** Be aware that odors from your cans affect your neighbors, so keep that in mind. The ACC will be checking and will issue warnings to violators.

POOL/SPA:

Effective July 15, 2024, *the daily pool hours for children under 18 are 10:00am to 1:00 pm*. Flyers were sent explaining the reasons and the updated pool and spa rules were put in your tubes. New signs are being *[continued in next column]* created and will be installed (if not already done). In the meantime, please read all the information passed out in the flyers. When possible, we will have monitors at the gates to answer questions. We are keeping these hours until after the "summer season", at which time the Board will assess the situation.

ESCROW NUMBERS:

Homes are selling, just not as quickly as in past years. Since January 1st we have opened 22 escrows with 3 cancellations and 16 closed escrows, which leaves 3 pending open escrows. 

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM By Mick Herod

SAFETY AND INFORMATION FAIR

The Fair was a huge success and was attended by just under 200 residents from all three units. We hope you were able to attend and take away some valuable information (and maybe raffle prizes). THANK YOU to ALL of the volunteers, vendors and behindthe-scenes workers for a wonderful job!

CALLE DE AMOR AUTOMATIC GATES:

The automatic gates at the intersection of Calle de Amor and Hunter Road are now fully operational. The two sliding gate motors are battery-operated. The 24-volt batteries are charged by solar panels atop each gate post, so are independent of any power outages. In fact, the batteries should still open and close the gates up to 100 times before the batteries need to be recharged, should we have extended periods of cloudy weather.

While the gates are activated by strobes on Fire and EMT equipment, there will also be a redundant *Knox* key switch to open the gates. Murrieta Fire can use their special *Knox* key carried in their vehicles. In addition, Police can open the gates using a universal remote kept in their vehicles.

A remote opener (clicker) is locked in the GKA Office, for periodic equipment testing and allowing emergency exit of residents.

Finally, gate motors can also be manually switched off, or in the extremely unlikely event of a total loss of battery power, the gates can still be opened by hand whenever battery power is not present.

RECYCLING:

Your assistance in recycling aluminum cans and CRV plastic bottles is a big asset to the ERT. About half of our budget comes from CRV redemption. As always, please leave caps on plastic bottles and it is appreciated if you can separate bottles from cans. And finally, all <u>glass</u> bottles (CRV or not) should go into your BLUE bin. This reduces the potential for injury while storing and sorting recyclables. If you're new to Golf Knolls, CRV recyclables can be left inside the gate, in the area between the Banquet Room and the pool. Thanks for your help!

OWNER SURVEYS AND THEIR IMPORTANCE TO YOU

Why all the flap over Owner Surveys?

By law, every 55-plus HOA is <u>required</u> (by law) to survey all owners every two years, per the Fair Housing Amendments Act of 1988. This Act allows age-restrictive "senior" communities without violating the law by permitting discrimination against families where occupants are 54 years old or younger.

"GKA could lose the right to be an agerestricted (55+) community."

Failure to prove that at least 80% of all GKA households meet the 55-plus requirement could cause GKA to lose the right to be an age-restricted community. The ONLY way that GKA can legally prove this is to have Owner Surveys that are <u>no older than two years.</u> It may seem like a chore, but we ALL need to complete our forms SOON, so that GKA is in compliance. STREETS/SAFETY/SIGNS REPORT By Alan Maretsky

Like they say, you hit the bricks running. And that's exactly what I've done.

I volunteered for the GK Board a bit over a month ago and was appointed Director of Streets and Safety. I was provided with 4 huge notebooks covering everything from parking rules to the ID tag numbers on the street lighting poles!

It's been a busy few weeks dealing with abandoned vehicles, overnight parking violations and workers blocking driveways, impeding Waste Management from doing their appointed rounds.

Some of the tasks I have been charged with are getting the repairs done to our portion of Via Zapata and mapping out a three-year plan for road rejuvenation. I also plan on reviewing the placement of Stop Signs and Yield Signs to make sure they're in compliance with the MUTCD (The Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices) for Streets and Highways. The state of California, City of Murrieta and most other municipalities follow the guidance of this manual which covers pretty much everything and anything related to road signs, lights, etc. Based on this manual, we have a few signs that are not in compliance and will be replaced with conforming signage.

I'd like to remind everyone that STOP SIGNS are designed for that purpose. They're not "Ignore" signs, so please STOP. I've seen a few close calls and I really don't want to hear the sirens from AMR, MPD and Fire Station 3 rolling up here because someone decided that they are exempt from the rules! The Board will be discussing some ways to ensure that vehicles DO stop (no, not speed bumps).

As a reminder, if you see a street safety issue, a street light acting strange, workmen blocking street access (other than public utilities), street damage or any other streetsrelated issues, please reach out to me directly at (661) 886-1117, or by email at maretsky52@gmail.com and I will respond as soon as possible.

NEW POOL RULES SUMMARIZED

These rules became effective in July.

- Children under 18 are only allowed between **10am and 1pm daily**. (This rule will be reviewed at the end of summer.)
- Residents must have a gate fob on their person and must accompany their guests.
- 6-guest limit per Lot while in the pool area.
- Smoking is only permitted in the smoking area on the north side of the parking lot.
- Shower before entering pool.
- Tie up long hair or use bathing cap
- Food or glass is prohibited in the pool area. Metal or plastic drink containers and snacks are OK.
- Lap lanes are reserved for resident seniors only.
- No large float devices except noodles and child "floaties."
- Only pets allowed are service animals.
- Use non-spray waterproof lotions, oils or creams.
- Children 3 and under must wear leakproof diapers or pants.
- No pool use by anyone having active diarrhea in the past 14 days.
- Running, diving, jumping, excessive splashing or pushing is not allowed.
- Loud games or playing catch is not permitted.

FIRE IN THE SKY?

Get ready for the peak of the Perseid Meteor Shower. Although the showers can be seen for about 6 weeks (beginning on July 15 this year), the peak (up to 100 meteors/hour) is on August 11-12.

There will be a quarter-moon then, setting around midnight. To see the most meteors, look up and to the North. If you can find an area without many lights, you'll see a larger quantity than somewhere near the city.

This is brought to you by the Comet Swift-Tuttle. At 16 miles wide, it is the largest object to repeatedly pass by earth. As the Comet's tail sheds ice, dust and debris (the size of a grain of sand), the friction with the atmosphere creates a glowing gas, giving a fiery show across the sky.

NEW DRIVER'S LICENSE RENEWAL (WRITTEN) TEST OPTION FOR AGE 70+

If you have a good driving record, California now has a new process for most seniors (over age 69) to renew their Driver's License online. No computer? You can always go to the Murrieta Library (44 computers) or the Senior Center (7 computers). Alternatively, you may use the MyDMV app on your smartphone. This same app will allow you to renew your vehicle registration or change your address online.

Skip the old 25-question "written" test and instead use the *e-Learning* NO FAIL video test from the comfort of your home. It's an open-book test. If you get a question wrong, go back, review the section and correct your answer. Go to *dmv.ca.gov* for more info.

UPDATE ON GKA HELPING HANDS PROGRAM

Our program got off the ground in late April. We have reached over three months. I am pleased to say that as a "team" our GKA Volunteers have completed over 35 separate assignments. Some are still pending and I will comment on those later in this article.

I want to thank all the residents who have requested our assistance, and I am pleased we could be there to help you! Due to the personal situations of some of our volunteers the total number available has been reduced, especially in the area of "gardening." If you are interested in joining our program please contact me at my number below. I welcome new volunteers! For those considering volunteering, I want you to know that under normal circumstances you may only have to volunteer to do one request in a week or so.

The jobs the volunteers have completed have been good and residents requesting help are very appreciative of your attitude and helpfulness!

An issue has arisen on several occasions regarding a few individuals that are requesting help. In a few cases those requesting help have the funds to hire outside individuals to help them with some of their issues. One reason for starting this project was to assist a large number of senior residents that either do not have the resources to get certain things done or are unable to do them. It is my opinion that we stay open to helping those "in need."

As we know, a person can have needs in their lives for a number of different reasons. I cannot stop a volunteer from withdrawing their help if they don't feel comfortable providing a helping hand in certain situations. If a volunteer wants to withdraw from a specific job, for whatever reason, that is okay with me. I do ask that after meeting with the person in need, the volunteer call one of the directors and advise us that they do not feel comfortable doing that specific job. We will release the volunteer and simply identify another volunteer who is willing to handle the job.

It is up to the volunteer to decide what is reasonable or not for them.

INFECTED COMPUTER SCAM

Here's how this works:

Someone will call, using a legitimate company name (like Microsoft, Norton, Amazon, etc.) claiming to be from "Tech Support." They explain that your computer is infected with a virus. They might even suggest that this virus is causing your computer to run sluggish. Chances are in the scammer's favor that your computer *is*, in fact, running sluggish. The scammer will then ask for access to your computer by having you (or allowing them to) install a program that will give them unlimited access.

Once the scammer has access, they can then infect your (previously virus-free computer). Their bogus program can literally "lock up" all your data. The ONLY way to get your data back is to pay a "ransom fee," possibly in the hundreds of dollars.

<u>No legitimate company can remotely detect</u> <u>that your computer is infected</u>. Protect yourself and *just hang up!*



You Are Not Alone

What is YANA?

The Yana Program is one of the many valuable public services provided by the Murrieta Police Department and the MPD Volunteers. YANA, or, You Are Not Alone, promotes peace of mind and a sense of community for the elderly or disabled who enjoy the independence of living alone but have no friends or family members available to check in on them with any consistency. While enrollees in the YANA Program are generally able to take care of their own day-to-day needs, they also recognize that a medical crisis in or about the home could render them helpless and worsen if their distress goes unnoticed.

How it Works

Monday thru Friday, a volunteer will make a phone call to the YANA enrollee. A daily log is kept verifying that contact was made and to note any special requests or information. During these phone calls, a volunteer will confirm the welfare of the enrollee, schedule the in-home visit, and to just have a casual conversation.

If a YANA enrollee does not answer the phone call, the volunteer repeats the call over a specified time period. If there continues to be no response, a volunteer will go to the YANA enrollee's residence for a welfare check. If they see a problem or still cannot make contact, a police officer is called to the scene immediately, and emergency medical aid may be requested.

One day during the week will be a visiting day for the YANA enrollee. Instead of a phone call, each YANA enrollee gets a personal visit from the volunteers. This brings a more personal touch to the program and ensures that the YANA enrollee's home and physical appearance are monitored. Anything out of the ordinary is logged and reported.

Who is Not Eligible

Elderly individuals with a mental health illness and who might pose a threat to the volunteers will not be eligible to be a YANA enrollee.

Cost

The YANA Program is provided FREE OF CHARGE to the citizens of Murrieta by the Murrieta Police Department and the MPD Volunteers as a service to the community.

NEW CALIF. TRAFFIC LAWS IN 2024


AB645 summary:

If you drive in Los Angeles, Glendale, Long Beach and other northern California cities, you could be receiving a citation by mail for speeding. (Yes, you read that right.) California politicians have approved a limited number of cameras to enforce speed limits. These cameras will be piloted in school zones and designated "safety corridors" over a five-year period.

AB413 summary:

Parking or stopping a vehicle along a curb within 20 feet of a *marked* crosswalk could get you a citation (whether the <u>curb</u> is marked or not). Local jurisdictions may establish different signage or curb marking.



- Renew your vehicle registration and receive a new sticker
- File for Planned Nonoperation (PNO status)
- Pay a vehicle registration suspension reinstatement fee
- Submit an Affidavit of Non-Use (ANU)
- Remove an ANU
- Submit proof of insurance when requested by the Vehicle Insurance Program
- Receive your driver's record
- Receive your vehicle record
- Receive a replacement registration card or sticker
- Replace your Driver's License

You will need a credit card for payment of [continued in next column] any fees and there is a small processing charge (less than 2%, but it's worth it). If you're a AAA Member, most of these same services are available there (but there may be a long line).
