Free chair exercise classes start Oct. 13

Residents from all three Knolls units are invited to Chair Exercise classes beginning Oct. 13.

Three times a week, members willgather in Spring Knolls' Eaker Hall for the exercises. The schedule allows you to miss a day and catch up fairly easily. It also allows you time in between to recover without sacrificing consistency.

These exercises are designed to be in a safe and friendly environment. If you have any concerns about such exercising be sure to talk to your physician.

The one-hour classes begin at 10:30 a.m. Mondays, Thursdays and Fridays. You should bring water and wear comfortable clothing

We'll vary between sitting and standing exercises with a variety of arm and leg exercises, as well as

some light weight (1 to 2-pound weights) exercises.

We work primarily to have fun and recondition our muscles and joints by strengthening our core and balance muscles, and improving flexibility and coordination.

We use music exercise videos to coordinate group activities. But you can vary the routine to fit your own needs. Some of us have muscle and joint issues that prevent certain exercises, but you can modify them to fit your personal needs.

You can slow down, go faster, make fewer specific movements or take a break to stretch or relax before continuing. There are only a few requirements: Don't injure yourself, know and stay with your limits, stay hydrated, breathe, and have fun.

(monitoring homeowners' projects). In addition to the directors, there are the board officers (president, vice president, secretary and treasurer).

When you run for the Board, you're running to be a director. The positions of responsibility are determined by the newly elected members after the Annual Meeting in January.

As volunteers the board members are saving all the owners including themselves the major expenses of hiring a management company.

Board candidate application forms are available by contacting Chris Heilbron, Nominating Committee Chair at 951-805-6376 or you can pick up an application from the literature holder under the bulletin

board by the clubhouse office door.

You can also be nominated, or you can nominate yourself at the General Meeting. This meeting is for members (owners) only. Refreshments will be served.

As a reminder, there are four open seats for the 2026 board of directors. Each candidate would be elected to a two-year term. If there are more than four candidates who decide to run, there will be a regular election.

If there are not at least four candidates, the board will vote to approve their election by acclamation in November.

If you don't feel you can commit to a Board position, perhaps you'd consider serving as a board support leader in an area that interests you.

We have a number of support leaders and are open to adding new ones to help address immediate and long-term issues.

New video camera system captures pair in after-hours visit to locked clubhouse

A weekend after-hours break in at the Spring Knolls clubhouse grounds was captured by a newly installed state-of-the art closed circuit system that nearly tripled the previous version's coverage.

Two people, a man and a woman, were seen late Sept. 21 and early the next morning wandering the patio area and later climbing a perimeter wall and fence before leaving.

There was no indication that anything was either taken or destroyed during the couple's two separate visits.

Murrieta police were contacted and evidence photos of the unidentified couple have been supplied to investigators.

The Security and Spy CCTV surveillance cameras were installed only weeks before to replace an outdated system that was limited to nine working video cameras. The new system nearly triples that coverage with 22 cameras. Many previously unprotected areas are now under 24-hour surveillance.

The system includes night vision and remote access by three people. Silent alarm features are expected to be added to the security mix.


