At the end of March, the pool area, pool restrooms, and such were inspected by the Riverside County Health Department, following a complaint from a resident. We expect to be inspected periodically. When a resident complains to an outside agency without complaining to the board, who may be able to rectify the complaint, it opens several issues. We may incur fines from the Health Department, which our association may not have budgeted for, which in turn may cause a special assessment to be levied against all residents. I know many of you do not want money to come out of your pockets. It may also lead to the complete shutdown of our pool facilities. Because of this, should you see further problems, please contact the board.

A few residents have been using the GKA mailbox, found outside the banquet room, as their own mailbox. Please stop! The GKA mailbox is not for outgoing mail. It is only for incoming mail. There is no guarantee that your mail will be picked up.

REMINDERS!! It is that time of year again, when after a rainy season, when the dreaded weeds sprout heavily.

The GKA Board is asking that all residents take time to concentrate on weed abatement, prior to written violations being issued, which can lead to fines being levied against lot owners who wish to defy ACC Guidelines, which require the removal of weeds. Also, all trash cans need to be brought in by 7 pm the night of trash day and placed out of sight.

Speaking of trash, due to the Memorial Day holiday, May 25th, trash pick-up will be a day late on May 29th.

Please follow these requests, which will keep our community looking attractive, and save

you money.

To all whose fobs do not work, you are not entitled to use our facilities until your fob is active. Please do not climb our fences or enter the grounds in any other way (we have some of you on camera). You will be trespassed. To any other member, do not let anyone in that claim to have left their fob at home. Some fobs are inactive for many reasons.

We are looking for a new Facility Director. Tom Larson resigned due to personal reasons.

Your board has voted to make the intersection of Calle Quedo and Via Del Sol a four-way stop. If you wish, please send comments about this plan.

Our next General Meeting will be in July.

require an annual meeting (in January), and then says "Board Meetings can be held as infrequently as every quarter." This was thoroughly researched and discussed before the Board made their decision.

The Board was criticized that adequate notice was not given about when the street and parking lot work started. Adequate notice was not given because the Board did not find out until three days before the work was going to be done. We are working with the other units on this project and had very little control over the work schedule. Every effort was made to

get the information out, but obviously not everyone got the news.

Unfortunately, our Board procedures do not allow these types of accusations to be addressed by the Board at the meeting. Therefore, one might think that the concern is valid, when in fact they have no merit at all, and an incorrect rumor could arise. I only ask that if you think you have a problem with a Board member, or an action by the Board, you bring your concern directly to the Board to determine its validity and how to properly address the matter. You can then publicly address your valid concern at a Board Meeting if you still feel it is necessary. ↗

STREETS/SAFETY/WEBMASTER

Well, it's that time of year again that some of our streets get repaved or fixed. I hope you will all have patience with me as I am new to this and still learning the terminology of the pavers. It truly is an education. As we continue with the year, I will be giving updates as to what streets are being worked on, when, and what is being done to them. As much as we plan things do go wrong or get changed and it is out of our control. Just know that I will do my best to stay on it and to notify you as soon as possible. It's imperative to know when your street is being worked on so that no cars are parked on the street that day or that night. If you want the latest up-to-the-minute updates, you can always go to www.gkahomes.com. Click on *Streets* in the menu and the updates will be there. It will be the fastest way for you to find out what's going on.

Friendly Reminder

Parking on the streets overnight is not allowed without a parking permit.

Parking permits can be obtained in the HOA office on Fridays between 9am and 12noon.

Overnight parking on the streets is not allowed without a parking permit. Vehicles may park on the street with a permit for 48 hours in a 30-day period. Exceptions need the Street & Safety committee approval. The reason for this is to make sure emergency vehicles have enough room to drive down our streets. Parking permits are available in the HOA office on Fridays from 9am to 12noon. One per household please and the pass will be assigned to that address.

Which leaves me to my final news for you. As it stands right now, we have suspended the website's ability to take HOA dues online. I say suspended because for now it's temporary. We are not happy with the company we are using to process the payments and are looking for a better option. ↗

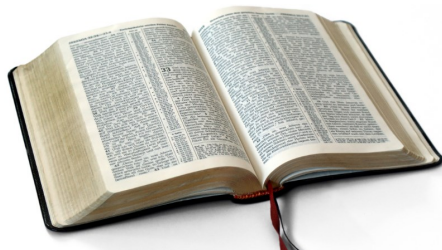

LOOKING UP

May debuts with a full moon (May 1), known as the flower moon, so named after all the flowers that typically bloom in late spring.

On May 5-6, the *Eta Aquarid* meteor shower peaks. Look to the East-Southeast.

On May 12-13, you can see Earthshine in the mornings. Earthshine is when the crescent moon is showing bright but the unlit part of the moon shows a glow due to reflection of light from Earth.

On May 19-20, you can see Earthshine in the evenings.

Finally, on May 31, it will be a Blue Moon. A Blue Moon is when there are two full moons in a single month. It's also a Micro Moon, when the moon is at its farthest distance from Earth. 🚩

If you have an emergency and need to turn off

your gas, water or electricity, could you do it? Do you even know where your water and gas meters are located?

How about stopping bleeding (both minor and major)?

Could you fashion an arm or leg splint, in the event of a fracture or sprain?

So you have a fire extinguisher...great. Now, do you know the proper techniques to keep yourself safe and extinguish the fire?

These are just a few of the topics that we will be covering in detail at the upcoming Safety Presentation. A free hot dog or hamburger will be yours at the end of the Presentation.

Currently Golf Knolls does not have direct access to our property for large maintenance equipment and personnel in the center area.

I've worked with the President of Spring Knolls to allow our landscaping company to pass over their land in order to do semi-annual weed control behind their residents' properties.

I'm asking that everyone in our Association respect the "NO TRESPASSING" signs placed across our property borders.

People have been seen passing beyond the signs, prompting calls from the Spring Knolls President, asking if we are aware of the activity. In every case, we were not aware.

Both Associations and residents are concerned about transients looking for a place to camp under the center tree area. In addition, a bobcat and coyote with pups have been seen living in this area. Since the area is not safe, it's another reason to respect the "NO TRESPASSING" signs.

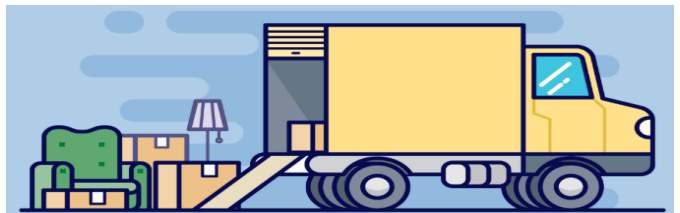
Important changes to ERT Meetings

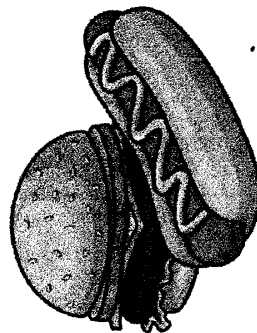
