Rules to use the pools

With summer vacation beginning, here are a few reminders for the use of the two Spring Knolls pools by residents and their guests.

- Residents must be present with a working FOB to enter grounds. There is a limit of 4 in a group at any time.
- No children under 3 in pool without rubber or plastic pants. No one under 18 allowed in large pool.
- Rude and uncooperative behavior will not be tolerated. Violators will be asked to leave and FOB privileges will be suspended for 30 days. Fines may also be levied.
- Posted pool rules will be enforced. They include no running, diving, jumping or bombing; no food or drink (except bottled water) in or around pool areas.
- No float devices except noodles.
- Swimming cap required with long hair, or tied back with band
- Do not open the gates for anyone. If you lack a FOB contact **Candy Lee at (951) 239-0669** for assistance.
- Be prepared to leave by no later than 8 p.m.

might scoff at such common-sense restrictions, but all 50 states require posting them.

And for good reason. They tell people how to stay safe. Many stem from the drowning deaths 61 years ago of a father and his 5-year-old son at a Palm Springs hotel. It was later determined that pool safety signage at the hotel might have helped save their lives.

That sad story came only a few years after a personal one when, as a child of 7 or 8, I went to a neighbor's pool party. As you can guess, everyone was playing joyfully until one child pushed a little girl into the water. While falling, she fractured her arm on the side of the pool.

Our fun party abruptly ended. Parents came to pick up their frightened kids, who watched tearfully as an ambulance rushed their screaming friend to an emergency room.

Had pool rules such as those at the clubhouse been posted, that child and everyone else might have had a great time that day and left with happy memories.

Our pool signage requirements are just as valid now as they were then. And, they're not going away.

Granted, a few rules are particular to our association, but all center around safety. They also are a reminder of liability insurance costs residents must pay if the HOA is held responsible for any tragedy.

Our Spring Knolls pool rules are posted by both pools. And rules added since the Covid-19 outbreak began, are on bright yellow paper on the poolside tables. The board recently updated those supplementary rules, and they are summarized on the front page.

One rule involving the large pool is that those using it must be at least 18. Since we're a 55-plus community, it isn't hard to distinguish who might be asked to show their IDs if a question arises. The smaller pool, meanwhile, is for kids of all ages.

Other rules, dealing with running, diving and jumping, have been posted here and elsewhere. And the signs are for your safety, not as a decoration. Grandparents and parents might even use them as a quick reading lesson before the kiddies enter the water the first time.

Failure to follow the rules will lead to an initial warning. If such a request is met with belligerence, rudeness or refusal to follow the rules you'll not only be asked to leave, but your Fob will be disconnected, your clubhouse privileges suspended, and you can expect a fine. So far most visitors have responded as adults when the rules have been pointed out to them. Unfortunately there have been some rude exceptions.

Our Spring Knolls clubhouse is the most popular in the area. It's clean, well managed and a place we can all be proud of. We want you to enjoy and love our pools, and genuinely hope you make new memories every time you use them.

So, enjoy the pools and follow the rules. And let's all have a great and fun summer!

Harvard Beets

This is a recipe my mom made for every holiday dinner and it's older than I am.

It's special to me because it's in my mom's cookbook binder of her favorites, but also because over the past several years I've made this dish for our neighbor, Madeline Dawe, more times than I can count.



Madeline loved beets; and could only eat foods prepared a certain way due to her swallowing disorder. This worked for her! Madeline recently passed away... and in her honor, here is the recipe ... *Harvard Beets for Madeline!*

Directions

Drain 1 No. 2 can of pineapple chunks, reserving the syrup.

Blend 2 tablespoons pineapple syrup with 2 tablespoons corn starch.

Drain 1 No. 303 can diced or julien beets; mix beet juice with 1/2 cup of the pineapple-syrup-and corn starch

mixture.

Heat juices, stirring constantly until thickened.

Add 1 tablespoon vinegar, 3/4 teaspoon salt; 1-1/2 cups drained pineapple chunks and the diced beets. Heat through. Serves 4 to 6.

Zucchini Pie From Steve Lopez

Ingredients

3 cups shredded zucchini
4 eggs or egg substitute
1 small onion—chopped fine
1/4 to 1/2 cup melted margarine
1 cup mixture of shredded mozzarella and parmesan cheese
1 cup Bisquick
1tsp chopped parsley
Black pepper to taste

Directions

Sauté onion until soft.

Mix all ingredients together.

Grease a 9-1/2 " pie plate.

Put mixed ingredients in plate and place in middle rack of preheated 350-degree oven.


Bake about 45-55 minutes until golden brown on sides and light brown on top. Test with knife in center. Should come out clean. Can be served hot or cold.

Another busy month at SKERT! Rachel Hollinger, the Emergency Preparedness Guru for the City of Murrieta, asked if we'd like to participate in an exercise with them for ShakeOut at 10:20 a.m. on Oct. 20.

The scenario would be that the Fire Department is swamped with calls, and we'd be on our own for several days.

We'd set up the first aid tents, mobilize the medical supplies, and conduct a drill in several Area Coordinator's territories.

It would be the first onsite drill since I became the chair of SKERT.

We also discussed plans for "block parties" in the areas without AC's, before the ShakeOut, to get more participation. More on that later....

Similar requirements affect other Southern California area codes (562, 626 and 949).
