The website shown in the image (*courtscali.com*) was flagged by Norton anti-virus as a dangerous website. Don't believe everything you read!

## EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

In light of the recent fires in southern California, the ERT will be honing our skills so that we are better prepared in the event of a park-wide emergency. One of the tools we use is an emergency entrance/exit in Golf Knolls. This provides a third way to exit.

Each Board member and selected ERT members have been provided with a key to open the emergency gate located at the end of Calle de Amor. Calle de Amor is the last street you pass on your left, before you get to the GKA Clubhouse. If you're not familiar with the gate, it is an emergency-only gate at the northeastern end of Golf Knolls and opens onto Hunter Road. The motorized gate is equipped with sensors that are activated by transmitters located on emergency equipment (Fire, Police and Emergency Medical Support). The gates can ONLY be opened by Emergency Vehicles or someone with a key. They will NOT automatically open if you drive up to them.

To maintain readiness, each ERT member is required to complete an emergency class before July 1, 2025. These classes include First Aid, CPR/AED and Stop the Bleed. ERT members will be reimbursed in full for each course completed.

Each member is also required to attend ERT refresher training this month. Finally, each member must attend at least 3 of 6 monthly ERT Meetings, where valuable information is discussed and exchanged.

We have about 20 members throughout Golf Knolls, covering many, but not all neighborhoods. The only way we can provide coverage for every neighborhood is to recruit more volunteers.

Once data collection is complete within your assigned neighborhood, it only takes about an hour a month to participate in a meeting. New members will be issued a 2-way radio, for

instant communication with the rest of the team. You may be the only person standing between your neighbor and immediate peril.

Please consider joining the volunteers of the ERT and make a potentially life-saving difference to the community.

We invite you to sit in on our upcoming training classes, held on Feb. 11, 12 or 13. There you can learn all about the ERT and see if it's a good fit for you. The times are as follows:

**7pm on Tuesday, February 11**

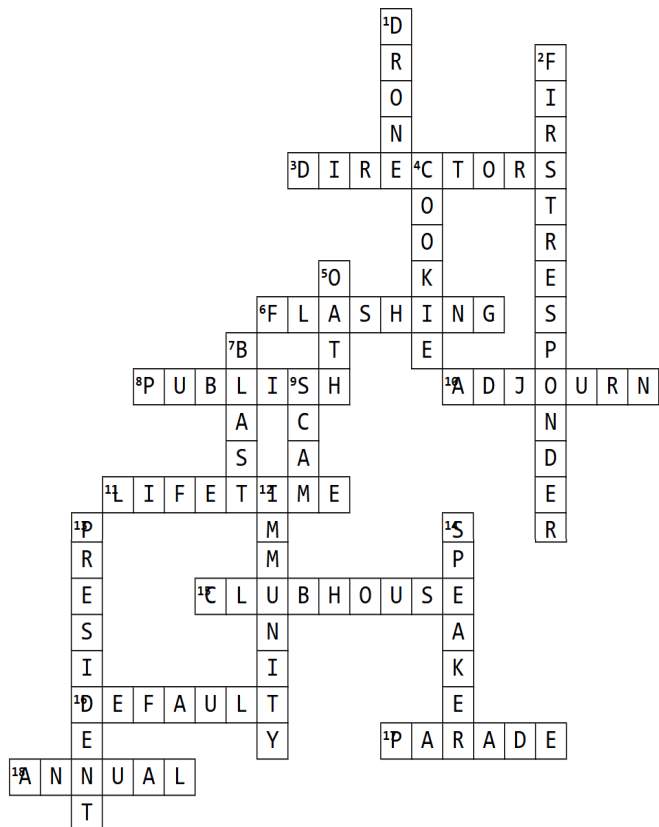
**4pm on Wednesday, February 12**

**7pm on Thursday, February 13**

The same material will be covered in all three classes, so pick the one that's most convenient for you. The classes should only take about an hour, and we meet in the **Card Room**.

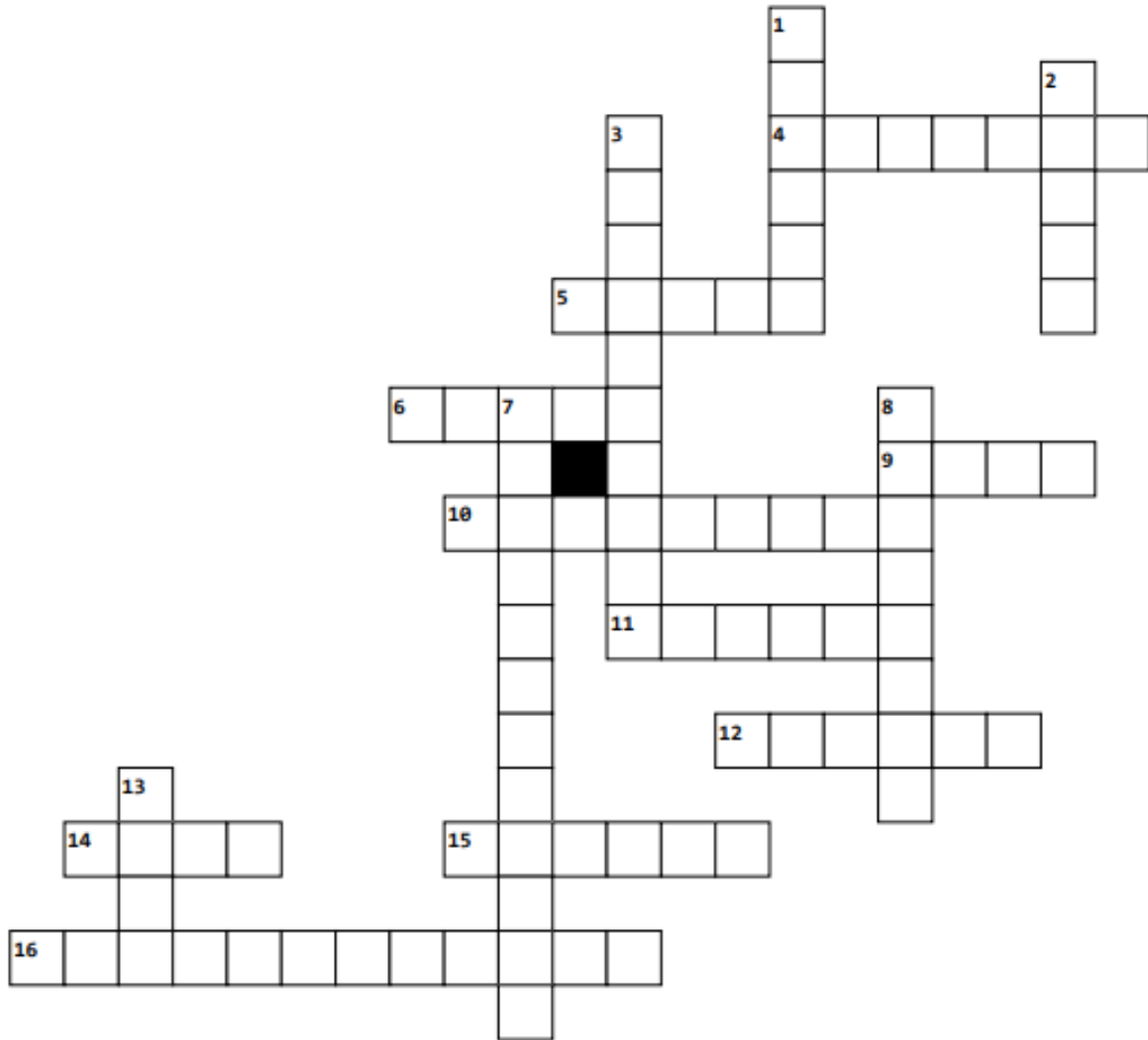
If you can't make any of those dates, our regular monthly meeting is held the following week (see the calendar on the back page). I hope to see you there, and look forward to being able to have you join our team!

**HELPING HANDS**

This report is directed to all the residents in GKA. This includes those that have received assistance when you requested it, or provided needed service to others as volunteers. Since we started last year the number of available volunteers has dropped to less than ten! Many of you have provided needed assistance to others in our community. For that reason and to strengthen our program, I am requesting a meeting of all interested residents and those who wish to volunteer.

Due to my schedule our next meeting is scheduled for Saturday, February 15 at 2pm in the meeting room. This will give residents time to consider what could work and how we raise our ability to assist others in need in a more frequent manner. For that to happen, my goal is to identify about 20 volunteers who are interested in helping their neighbors who need assistance.

Although I am still positive about our program, we need to find a way where needed volunteers are available at least once every two weeks. At this time I am thinking about reducing several types of assistance I have included in our program up to now. Everyone has their own lives to live, work to do and we all have other issues that often infringe upon our time.

Until we get stronger and more volunteers are available, I am suggesting we reduce our assistance items to the following: Taking residents out for shopping, taking residents to their doctor appointments in Murrieta and Temecula, dog walking and visiting with residents by phone or in person.

We tried to do "gardening" last year, but that did not work. If the committee that meets believe this is a good idea going forward, we need to create at least 3-4 teams, with 3-4 volunteers per team, so it will easier on our volunteers. We all know the temperature will get warmer starting in March. I am not going to send out just one volunteer to provide this assistance.

Some of you have told me you have different suggestions regarding what types of assistance we can provide. However, until we get better organized, with more volunteers, adding additional items we are unable to respond to, we must leave them out until we grow stronger!
