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As had been mentioned before, a significant amount of the *ERT's*_budget comes from CRV recyclables redemption. Sometime this year, the *City of Murrieta* and *Waste Management* may institute "forced" recycling – that is, you will likely be asked to sort recyclable materials (cardboard, paper, plastic containers, glass, cans and plastic bottles) from household garbage. If, or when this occurs, please understand that <u>you will still be free to contribute your CRV</u> recyclables to the *ERT*, just as you're doing today. Please recycle all glass containers at home, the small return on deposits and potential for injury when handling glass in bulk are just not worth it; however, please DO recycle CRV cans and bottles leaving bottle caps on the empty containers.



<u>RECALL</u> – <u>GENERAL MOTORS</u> is recalling all self-driving vehicles and suspending driverless operations nationwide. The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) revoked the license for *Cruise*, which was transporting passengers without human drivers.

<u>TOYOTA</u> is recalling 1.9 million RAV4s and small SUVs to fix a problem with batteries that can move during forceful turns and potentially cause a fire. The recall covers certain RAV4s from the 2013-2018 model years. TOYOTA is still preparing a fix and when ready, dealers will replace the hold-down clamp, battery tray and positive terminal cover with improved ones and will notify owners by late December.

<u>HONDA</u> is recalling 250,000 vehicles in the U.S. because the connecting rod bearing in the engine can wear and seize due to a manufacturing error, damaging the engines. The engines could run improperly or stall while being driven. The recall covers certain 2018 and 2019 HONDA Pilot SUVs and ODYSSEY mini-vans and some 2017 and 2019 RIDGELINE pickup trucks. Also affected are certain 2019 to 2020 ACURA TLX cars and some 2018 to 2020 ACURA MDX SUVs. Dealers will inspect and repair or replace the engines if needed. Owners will be notified by mail starting January 2nd.

<u>HONDA</u> is also recalling select 2023 - 2024 ACCORD and HR-Vehicles due to a missing piece in the front seat belt pretensioners; more than 300,000 ACCORDS and HR-V's are potentially affected. Dealers will inspect and replace the seat belt pretensioner assembly at no cost.

<u>TESLA</u> is recalling nearly all vehicles sold in the United States which is more than 2 million, to update software and fix a defective system that is supposed to ensure drivers are paying attention when using Autopilot. The recall covers *models Y, S, 3 and X* produced between October 5, 2012 and December 7 of 2023

<u>TYSON</u> is recalling nearly 30,000 pounds of chicken dinosaur-shaped FUN NUGGETS, due to possible contamination with metal pieces. The nuggets carry the number P7211 on the back of the package. The USDA urged consumers with the nuggets in their freezers to throw them out or return them to the place of purchase.

<u>OUAKER OATS</u> (Owned by PepsiCo) is recalling several of its granola products, including Quaker Chewy Bars and cereals, saying the foods could be contaminated with salmonella. According to the Food and Drug Administration (FDA), salmonella infections can cause fever, diarrhea, nausea, vomiting and stomach pain. The company is asking customers with recalled products to throw them away and contact its customer support line or visit the recall website for more information and reimbursement. WARNING -

 The U.S. health regulators are warning consumers and Amazon not to use/sell more than two dozen varieties of over-the-counter <u>EYE</u> <u>DROPS</u> because of the risk of infections that could lead to blindness. The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) advisory applies to lubricating drops sold by Amazon, CVS Health, Target, Rite Aid, Cardinal Health. Amazon is removing seven eye products after the FDA warned the company. The eye drops named are Pink Eye Relief, The Good-bye Company Pink Eye, Can-C Eye Drops, Optique 1 Eye Drops, Oclu-Med Eye Drops, TRP Natural Eyes Floaters Relief and Manzanilla Sophia Chamomile Herbal Eye Drops.

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- 2. <u>WANA-BANA</u> <u>FRUIT</u> <u>PUREE</u> The FDA is warning parents/grandparents against buying a brand of fruit puree since the snacks were found to have high levels of lead. Lead was found in Wana-Bana Apple Cinnamon Fruit Puree pouches which are sold nationally at SAM's Club, Amazon and Dollar Tree. If consumed, contact the child's health care provider for a blood test. Symptoms of lead exposure include headache, abdominal pain, vomiting, anemia, muscle aches, irritability and fatigue.
