RV and overnight parking hangers are now available! No charge for one hanger per lot. The pass is yours to keep, but there is a \$8 replacement fee if it is lost. There is a maximum of 48 hour use and remember, cones are required for RV's parking overnight. RV or guest parking is only allowed in front of your house. There is no guest parking anywhere else in the community. Please contact Brian Chute to get your tag.

Updates on street paving: the agreement with Competitive Paving has been signed. Select Goff Knolls streets will be done, starting in August. Details coming soon.

However, street sealing and crack sealing in other units is scheduled to begin July 8. Streets affected are Via Del Largo, Via La Colina, Calle De La Siesta and Via El Avion.

Please drive safely and make a **full stop** at each STOP sign.

Late in July or early August, stop by the Laundry Room (where the ice machine is located) and check out the all-new state-of-the-art washers and dryers (including high load capacity machines). Wash, Inc. provides the machines, along with maintenance, signage of how to operate and how to submit a request for a refund if necessary. These new machines come equipped with credit/debit card readers and even an app for your Smartphone (WASH Connect), where you can add your credit or debit card information and pay using your smart phone. Machines will no longer be able to accept coins.

In addition, a fresh coat of paint was applied to the entire room, provided by my all-star Facilities Committee members.

Three large parking lot lights were installed atop existing light poles on both sides of the cell tower, which now light up the entire area, adding safety and assistance getting to your vehicle when the sun goes down.

The outdoor spa is now heated to 102° F, with excellent water jets providing a therapeutic experience to sooth those aches and pains from which you may suffer.

The indoor spa is now heated to a reduced 92° F. The jets are a little flat, but the pump that drives the air to the jets is being analyzed for repair or replacement. Both spas had new dial-style timers for the jets recently installed. Simply turn the dial up to a maximum of 15 minutes and enjoy.

Bids are being collected for work on the former Library, which was located in the office lobby. ADA requires a wider pathway to the bathroom for someone in a wheelchair, so a portion of a wall will be removed. In addition, the two metal fences and raised floor will be removed, with a future design featuring a small meeting/break room for Board use. Also, the room will contain secured archived lot files and copier paper storage.

Look for new signage on all three gates, both spas, defibrillators and in the Laundry Room, displaying rules, reminders and how-to info.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL

July is my favorite month. Gardens are growing, and flowers are blooming. The May and June showers have also resulted in significant weed growth. Please keep ahead of the weeds. This is the ACC's most common Curbside Violation.

The June General Meeting saw a lower attendance, possibly due to the pleasant spring weather. However, those in attendance engaged in important discussions and shared information.

The Architectural Control Committee (ACC) has received frequent inquiries regarding project rejections, prompting a reminder about

the city's permit requirements. Many homeowners may not realize that certain projects require official approval from the City of Murrieta before work can commence. Generally, any project directly attached to a home necessitates a permit, regardless of size.

Projects requiring permits include:

- Roof replacements
- Electrical outlet installations
- Window frame modifications
- Kitchen and bathroom remodeling
- Pool, spa, and hot tub installations
- Home additions, including seasonal rooms
- Equipment replacements, such as furnaces, water heaters, and fireplaces
- Tall fences and decks

To avoid delays, homeowners are encouraged to consult the **Murrieta Building Safety Department** before submitting an ACC request. Additionally, regulations for **freestanding sheds** state that they must be placed at least five feet from the rear property line and three feet from the side property line. Any shed exceeding **120 square feet requires a permit**. The ACC advises all residents to stay informed on local

requirements to ensure a smooth approval process for their home projects.

The ACC would also like to welcome Vicki Davis our new subcommittee chair for exterior house painting approvals. Her team members include Marlene Phelps, Pam Byers and Glenda Smith. Welcome to the ACC team.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

How many of you have at least one fire extinguisher in your home? If you couldn't raise your hand, you're not alone.

Now, for those who *do* have an extinguisher, would you be able to use it to properly put out a fire?

Read on to find some great information on purchasing and using an extinguisher.

Typical residential extinguishers are designed for these types of fires:

Class A—Wood, paper, fabric, etc.

Class B—Flammable liquids and lithium batteries

Class C—Electrical fires

Class K—Kitchen fires (grease, oil), required in commercial kitchens

Classes A and B have a rating. The Class A rating uses numbers; higher numbers are more effective. A 4A extinguisher will be more effective than a 2A.

Class B ratings also use a number. A 20B rated unit can put out a fire that is about 20 square feet.. A 40B rated unit can cover about 40 square feet.

Class C doesn't use a number. Warning: older extinguishers may **ONLY** have an AB rating. **DO NOT** use these on Class C Electrical fires, as the main retardant contains water! Water and electricity is a lethal combination.

The ratings will be shown on the label in a format such as 2-A:10-B:C. Online price for this size (at Walmart) was around \$45 as of late June, but Costco has a better 3-A:40-BC on sale for \$29.99 through 7/20/25. Sam's Club has a Class ABC and Class K twin pack of 1-A:10:BC online for \$30. First Alert is a well-known brand for home use.

Now that you know which type of extinguisher

to use (most common is Class ABC), you need to know the correct way to use the extinguisher. Here are some guidelines from the internet:

BEFORE the fire, check the gage on the top of the unit. The needle should be in the **green**. If not, dispose of the unit and buy a new one. It's generally cheaper to buy a new unit than to get one refilled (if it's even possible).

When using an extinguisher, use the PASS method:

PULL the pin

AIM the extinguisher hose or nozzle at the **BASE** of the fire

SQUEEZE the top handle to discharge

SWEEP across the base of the fire, from right to left or vice-versa

Note that to put out most fires you will need to be within about six feet. Once the fire subsides and it's safe, move in closer to make sure it's completely out. **DON'T** turn you back on a fire that you think is out...it could re-ignite. Slowly walk backwards, facing toward the combustibles, until you are satisfied that the fire is completely out.

Remember that you will have a limited amount of retardant in the extinguisher, so make every drop count. Once the extinguisher has been used (even briefly), expect the gage to no longer be in the green, meaning you will need to replace it immediately.

A no-maintenance alternative to an extinguisher is a fire blanket. They do not expire and are effective in depriving a fire of oxygen. These are made of fiberglass, which will not burn in a typical small fire (think pots or pans on the stovetop). Of course, once used, it should be immediately replaced.

Pros of a fire blanket: they can be used on humans, they don't make a mess as would a fire extinguisher's chemicals and cause less damage to appliances. Cons: you must smother the fire for the blanket to be effective.

In CERT training, you're advised not to attempt to put out any fire bigger than a trash can. Instead, dial 911 immediately and evacuate the area. Property can be easily replaced...your life cannot.

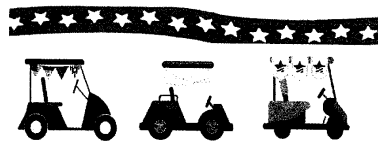

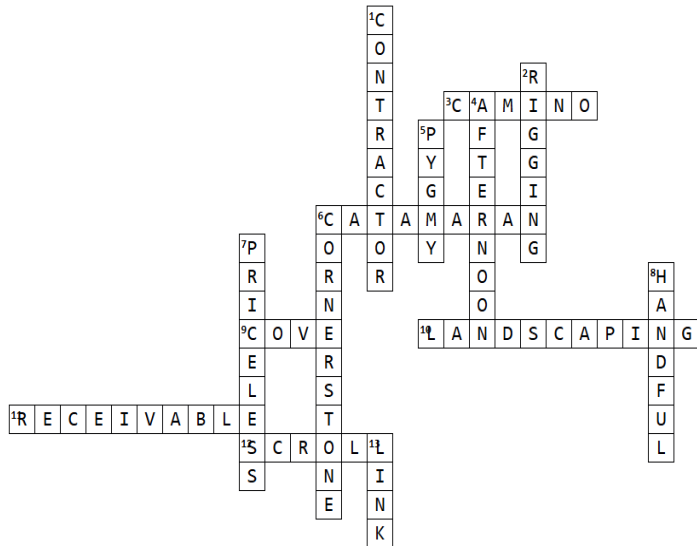
