
WOMEN'S SOCIETY - GLENDA SMITH PRESIDENT

BARRY CHARELLE has an interesting scam he wanted to share with everyone. He received a letter stating that this person was an attorney from Canada, and he was actively searching next of kin for his client, who passed away. They wanted BARRY to add his name to this insurance policy; they then wanted him to contact them. The goal of a scam message is to get the user to click on a malicious link or share their personal or financial information. It's important to take your time when receiving such messages, as scammers hope you'll make a rash decision because the message seems urgent.

Scammers try to convince you that you are owed or entitled to money or winnings that you did not expect to receive. The scammer asks you to pay a fee or to reveal your personal information. Hang up if this is a phone call. Do not respond in any way to the sender. In this day and age, we have to be vigilant.

A HELPING HAND - FROM PETER KOFOED

I am leaving this communication with each of you. We have had several meetings on the NEIGHBOR TO NEIGHBOR —HELPING HAND PROGRAM. There has been an interest in this program by a number of members, but not sufficient number of volunteers to get this program off the ground. The following information will hopefully allow you to make a personal decision on this program. If we don't come with the needed number of volunteers, we will not be able to go forward with the program at this time.

For those of you that have asked, this program is not controlled by the GOLF KNOLLS ASSSOCIATION (GKA). As a 'community', GOLF KNOLLS has plenty of the needed and talented participants to make this program successful. Our neighbors in the other two 'levels' are also working on similar programs. I know the people involved and am in communication with them as we all move forward with this type of program. Down the line, there may be a possibility that all three levels merge their programs so we can do more together!

On a positive note, we have now confirmed about ten (10) volunteers to help us with implementing our program (going to resident homes to assist); but we still need more volunteers. If you are interested in volunteering or finding out more information, please call me (PETER) at (858) 722-0823. Leave me your full name and cell phone number, I will call you back and we can discuss the 'volunteer' part of this program.

HELPING HAND (Continued)

In order to get this program moving, we need to create a 'structure' that will allow this committee to receive calls from those that need assistance, and contact the available volunteer that can and will handle the neighbor's issue(s). Just so you are aware, as a volunteer, you will NOT be called every day to provide assistance. With about 15 - 20 volunteers we can spread out our assistance among those interested in helping.

Right now, to move forward, I need at least five to seven volunteers that will be available to receive calls from our residents when they need assistance. I have a person available who will create a connected phone system for those of us who will serve as the first level of response. The resident's call will pivot from volunteer to volunteer (using the same number) until one of us answers the call. That person's job will be to find out what type of assistance is needed; when; and then checking a list of volunteers (all of us will have a copy of those volunteers willing to go to the residence of the caller and provide the various types of assistance).

Once we get the 5-7 volunteers that will receive calls, we can move forward. That means that the 5-7 volunteers, plus SHARON and I, will be in the circle of those that receive calls. I am in the process of asking residents what their special needs for assistance are, so we can respond appropriately for the caller and the volunteer. When we get the 5-7 volunteers that will receive calls, we will then get the phone system set up. At that point we can start to address the needs of those in our community.

I hope this information is helpful for those of you who have indicated to me they want to "help". On a side note, the 5-7 volunteers do not have to be permanent. Once we discover how many persons will be needed to receive calls, we can always rotate individuals in and out of these positions. I hope this makes sense to everyone. If it is not clear, please call me so we can discuss, and answer any questions or concerns.

• <u>RECALLS - FORD</u> – is recalling nearly 43,000 Bronco Sports SUVs from 2022 and 2023 as well as Escape SUVs from 2022, all with 1.5 liter engines. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) said the fuel injectors can crack, causing gasoline or vapors to leak at a high rate onto hot surfaces in the engine compartment. Owners were to be notified by letter starting April 1. FORD said it will extend warranty coverage for cracked fuel injectors so owners who experience the problem will get replacements. Repairs are already available and details of the extended warranty will be available in June.

<u>STELLANTIS</u> - Nearly 318,000 **DODGE CHARGER** and CHRYSLER 300 sedans from 2018 through 2021 are being recalled because the side airbag can explode with too much force and hurl metal fragments at drivers and passengers. Dealers will replace both side airbag modules. Owners will be notified starting May 3. Owners who are concerned about driving their cars should contact the company.

RECALL (Continued)

STARBUCKS-BRANDED MUGS - NESTLE USA is recalling more than 440,000 metallic STARBUCKS branded holiday mugs because they can overheat or break when micro waved or filled with extremely hot liquid. The holiday mug sets were not sold in STARBUCKS stores but rather sold on line and in-store at TARGET, WALMART and at NEXCOM the military retail outlet. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) said customers should immediately stop using the mugs. They can return them to where the mugs were purchased or contact Nestle USA for a full refund.

LUNCHABLES - CONSUMER REPORTS have tested the popular snack kits known as Lunchables and found that the packaged and process foods within have high levels of lead and sodium. Tests were performed on the Kraft Heinz Lunchables snack kits, as well as similar products from brands including Armour LunchMakers, Target's Good Gather, Greenfield Natural Meat and Oscar Mayer. According to a post on Consumer Reports website, "in all cases, the tests found the snack kits had potentially concerning heavy metal and phthalate levels; and they're too high in sodium, especially for kids." The report noted that none of the kits tested exceeded any legal or regulatory limits for food safety. However, five of the twelve tested products would expose someone to over half of the maximum allowable dose for lead or cadmium, according to regulations in California.

- SCHEMES, SCAMS, AND FLIM-FLAM U.S. taxpayers are expected to get a bigger return this year. According to the latest IRS statistics, the average income tax refund so far this season is \$3,011 up \$123 from last year. Two out of three taxpayers expect to receive a refund. So far, the IRS has delivered more than \$200 billion in refunds through early April. The IRS warns taxpayers to be on the lookout for a new scam mailing that tries to mislead people into believing they are owed a refund. The new scheme involves a mailing coming in a cardboard envelope from a delivery service. The enclosed letter includes the IRS masthead with contact information and a phone number that do not belong to the IRS and wording that the notice is "in relation to your unclaimed refund." Thousands of people have lost millions of dollars and their personal information to tax scams. Scammers use the regular mail telephone and email to set up individuals, businesses, payroll and tax professionals. The IRS does not initiate contact with taxpayers by email, text messages or social media channels to request personal or financial information; be wary and on guard for these scams
