FROM THE PRESIDENT

Let me start off with good news for our association, and especially for our Board.

At the GKA members open meeting on February 9th, Tom Larson was appointed and sworn in as our new Facilities Director through 2026. Tom has been a great asset to GKA in helping wherever he can at our facility, and on various committees.

We are still in need of filling the ACC Directors seat and Director at Large position.

A big thank you goes out to our Secretary, Jane Recht, for getting our facility re-keyed. Jane has assured us that only those, due to their position within GKA, are in possession of GKA keys. Anyone that has old keys to the facility and no longer holds a position with GKA and sub-committees, your keys no longer work. Also, for those that use the gym/exercise room, the keypad combination has been changed. The combination uses the same numbers, but you now enter numbers one at a time in descending order, largest to smallest number, then push enter. Please note you must fill out a release of liability if you wish to use the gym. You may obtain the release at the office on Fridays between 9am and 12pm.

Owner surveys were sent to all owners within GKA and must be filled out and returned within 30 days of receipt, or face being fined.

If you, as an owner, are renting out your property, you must include your tenant(s) information. These surveys are required every two (2) years per law, to keep our 55+ status.

To those attending our monthly open meetings and wish to speak, you must read and fill out the Request to Speak Form and present it to our Secretary prior to the start of the meeting. No requests will be accepted after the meeting begins. Speakers are only allowed 3 minutes to speak, as is written on the request form. When you are advised your

time is up, please return to your seat. If you continue to speak, you may be asked to leave the meeting. Also, as a reminder, only property owners are allowed to speak as they are members of GKA. If your name is not on title documents within your lot file, you are not considered a member.

Get to know the Board of Directors. It has been reported that a prior Board member is approaching fellow residents in a threatening, hostile manner, trying to enforce perceived rules violations and has mentioned the fact that he once served on the board or is on the Board. This individual has nothing to do with the current Board nor does he represent this Board. You need not follow his direction as he holds no authority in enforcing any of the rules. If you have such an encounter and feel threatened or harassed, report it to the police. No one needs to be bullied.

Any member of GKA who feels there is a fellow owner in violation of our rules and regulations, please notify the board in writing of the violation, listing your lot number, phone number, and signature. It is the Board's responsibility to investigate violations, not individual owners.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM By Mick Herod



The ERT now has three 55-gallon drums of fresh water (with a non-chlorine preservative) available for emergencies.

We also have twenty-five inflatable splints, used for immobilizing hands, feet, arms and legs, in case of injury.

Stop-the-Bleed kits are available for minor bleeding, as well as tourniquets for major injuries.

The ERT has five small and one large Emergency Generator, as well as propane tanks for each unit. 🚩

SHOUT OUT TO THE WOMEN'S SOCIETY AT THEIR JANUARY LUNCHEON By the City of Murrieta

This article appeared in the City of Murrieta Fire and Rescue February Newsletter:

City Leaders Present to Local Women's Group

Murrieta Council Member Cindy Warren led a community update presentation to the Golf Knolls Women's Society, where Fire Chief Bernie Molloy and other City leaders shared information about Murrieta's services and future planning. During his portion of the presentation, Chief Molloy highlighted Murrieta Fire & Rescue's role in supporting a growing community. He shared that firefighters responded to 13,815 emergency calls last year, a 12 percent increase from the previous year. Most calls were medical emergencies, with more than 10,000 EMS responses. He explained that every Murrieta firefighter is also a paramedic, which allows crews to deliver advanced medical care quickly when residents need help the most.

Chief Molloy also shared how the department protects lives and property throughout the city. Fire crews responded to 146 cardiac arrest calls and restored a heartbeat 30 percent of the time, well above the national average. Firefighters also handled 154 fires and saved more than 88 percent of the value of affected structures, protecting over \$45 million in property. He noted that the City continues to plan ahead by investing in new equipment, including the delivery of a 100-foot ladder truck later this year. MFR remains committed to serving residents as the city continues to grow.

LOOKING UP IN MARCH

The full moon occurs on March 3 and is called the Worm Moon, so named as the time when earthworms begin to emerge as the soil warms, signaling the arrival of Spring. It can also be called the Blood Worm Moon because later that evening, we'll be able to observe a total lunar eclipse, where the moon will appear completely red.

On March 20, we'll celebrate the Vernal (Spring) Equinox (*equal night*), the point where the Equator is perpendicular to the Sun. This day will have roughly 12 hours of

night and 12 hours of daylight, with the daylight hours increasing until we reach the Summer Solstice (first day of Summer). If the Earth didn't tilt on its axis (by about 23.4 degrees) and move between north to south, there would be no seasons. Interestingly, every planet in our solar system (excluding Mercury) rotates on a tilted axis, from about 2.5 degrees up to 28.3 degrees, depending upon the planet.

During Saturn's Equinoxes, the planet's rings appear on edge, as viewed from Earth. 🚩

Items NOT accepted are tires, latex, oil or paint, fluorescent light tubes, empty drums, batteries, motor parts, pool chemicals, commercial or remodeling waste, transmission/brake fluid, weed killers/herbicides, bleach or tub cleaners, fertilizers, pesticides and rodent poisons, anti-freeze, solvents, gasoline, and engines.
