- For one thing, it's first offering, and then going, shopping for a neighbor who can't drive or even walk well. And, not just once.
- Or, it can be something as simple as changing a smoke detector's or a TV remote's batteries for someone not able to do it themselves.
- Or, maybe it's trimming your neighbors bushes or pulling their weeds because they can't afford to pay someone else to do it.
- Or, taking them to the doctor, because, well, Uber's too expensive, and, "what is that *Uber* again?"
- Or, bring out your neighbor's trash can for the weekly pickup and put it away afterward.

Everyone reading this could devise even better examples, and many are likely nodding that they not only do all these things I mentioned, but much more. I applaud them all.

When we all moved to Spring Knolls, it was no secret we were becoming a part of a senior community. You learn quickly what I mean. Participating in the Spring Knolls lifestyle can be challenging, inspiring and, yes, rewarding.

Thankfully, there are a number of "youngins," as I refer to them, who recognize the needs of fellow residents who have a few more years under their belt. They're eager to give back. To them, it's not charity; it's humanity. More than that, it's respect.

Among our Support Leaders is a void of Senior Helpers. Senior Helpers take phone calls from those needing help. They might then refer the caller to a county agency, or to a resident who's offered to help seniors. Or maybe, "give back" themselves.

Senior Helpers also need your help. Many residents could use a helping hand, but are reluctant to seek it, oftentimes until it's too late.

If you have neighbors who you feel need help, but are too shy to ask for, or accept it, call a Board member and let someone know so there's follow-up for them. No one who needs help should go without it.

When I was only 7, our church asked for someone to step forward to lead a high school Girl Scout troop. My mom volunteered. The commitment my parents made to that troop left a lasting impression on me. Years later I was a Girl Scout and as an adult served as a leader for six years for my daughter.

My parents took the troop camping to Cuyamaca. All we had was a shell camper on the back of my dad's pickup truck. Other families saw the need and joined in. We had a wonderful time. We cooked on those old green propane camp stoves. Made s'mores over the camp fire. Told ghost stories. Slept under the stars.

Decades later I smile at the memories and am thankful for them.

So, no matter who you are, what you have or what you don't have, you can help people and make a difference in their lives. And yours.


POOL USE IS NEAR: The large clubhouse pool has been awaiting the arrival and installation of a new heating system. We expect its reopening soon. Thanks for your patience. For now, only the smaller pool is available.

NO DRINKING, NO SMOKING: Those using the dog park are being reminded at the entrance that the use of alcohol and smoking is not permitted. Violators are subject to fines. This applies to both humans and their pets.



DOG DAYS: While we're at it... remember the **5-Second rule** during the upcoming heat waves: If you can't hold the back of your hand on the pavement for 5 seconds, it's too hot for your dog's bare paws.

'FOREVER' SOME-TIMES MEANS JUST THAT: For the past 15 years, the US Postal Service has been selling Forever Stamps to replace those first class stamps that once had an amount on their face. The first, in 2007, cost 41 cents (see photo). Today, they cost 58 cents, and beginning on **July 10**, the price will go up to **60 cents**. If you happen to have any 2007-issued 41-cent ones in a desk drawer, they'll be worth 19 cents more when the price increases. If you think that's worth writing home about, make sure to use a Forever stamp when you do!



SPEAKING OF MAIL: The annual independent audit of Spring Knolls' balance sheet by the CPA firm of Sonnenberg & Co. is behind schedule and will likely be mailed to all residents in early May.

MAILBOXES: If you're parked within 15 feet of a mailbox it interrupts delivery efficiency. You're also violating a Riverside County ordinance and may be cited.

Taco Soup

"This is absolutely delicious and unbelievably easy. Includes a vegetarian version...."

Ingredients:

1 pound hamburger (for a vegetarian version, use meat substitute)



- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 package Schilling original taco seasoning
- 1 1-pound pack of frozen corn
- 1 16-oz can of beans (I like black)
- 1 28-oz can crushed tomatoes (Roasted tomatoes add to flavor)
- 3 cups chicken broth (For vegetarian, use Better-Than-Bouillon vegetarian.)

Directions:

1. Brown meat and onion together.
2. Add taco seasoning and stir together
3. Add remaining ingredients, bring to a boil, and simmer for a few minutes to allow flavors to blend.
4. Serve with grated cheese topping.

Janet's Banana Bread- From Sandy Vollmer

"I've tried many varieties for this treat. This is by far the best ever..."

Ingredients:

- 1/2 cup butter, melted
- 1 cup white sugar
- 2 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1-1/2 cups all purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts
- 2 bananas, sliced & slightly mashed

Directions:

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 9 x 5 inch loaf pan.
2. In a large bowl, stir together the melted butter and sugar. Add the eggs and vanilla, mix well. Combine the flour, baking soda and salt, stir into the butter mixture until smooth. Finally, fold in the sour cream, walnuts and bananas. Spread evenly into the prepared pan.
3. Bake at 350 degrees for 60 minutes or until a toothpick inserted into the center of the loaf comes out clean. Cool loaf in the pan for 10 minutes before removing to a wire rack to cool completely. Yummy!

The most important piece of business for this month is that the Red Cross is coming back to the Knolls for another round of smoke detector installations!

In addition, they have a limited number of bed-shaker alarms for the hard-of-hearing and will be installing those, as well.

These installations will occur between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Saturday, May 21.

Please contact either Cindy Woody (319) 239-7797 or me (714) 493-1709 if you would like your home to receive this emergency equipment.

Also, if you had smoke detectors installed two years ago you don't need them again because the batteries in the latest devices are good for 10 years.

Even if you don't need an installation, please help us by mentioning this important service to your neighbors; so



we can get as many residents signed up as possible. The Area Coordinators may visit you to remind you as well!

By the time you read this, we should have received the furniture straps from the Earthquake Country Alliance.

A reminder, we won a grant from the alliance for several hundred dollars worth of straps, and we'll be helping residents install them. In the event of an earthquake, these small but effective straps attach your most vulnerable furniture to your walls.

Such installations should not only protect your furniture, but more importantly also protect you and your loved ones from serious injury.

Please let us know if you need them.

When Trust is a weapon: Senior scams

Here are some tips about avoiding potential scam opportunities aimed at seniors:

- Don't assume an offer is genuine because you saw it in a newspaper or on a legitimate job website. If you spot a suspicious listing, report it to the publication or site.
- Be cautious with listings that claim no skills or experience are required.
- Be cautious if asked to pay up-

front for training, certifications, materials, etc. The median loss for victims is roughly \$1,200.

- Be cautious if the job offers high pay for little or no work.
 - Don't sign a contract or make a payment without doing homework about the company.
 - If you believe you've responded to a scam, file a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission or State Attorney General.

- **FREE Snake removal:** Glenn @ (951) 642-2897 or Henry @ (951) 202-1130 They respond quickly. For rattlesnakes you can also call the fire department.
- **Bees?** In early morning when bees are asleep, spray their honeycomb with ammonia. It will not harm them, but they will leave. Or, call a bee removal service.
- **Report what you see.** If you see something, say something! Once reported to the police you may contact me about a blast out SKCindy2020@yahoo.com
- **Home security:** ALWAYS keep your doors locked even if you're in your home.
- **Supplies ready?** Have your TO GO BAG ready in case of an emergency.
- **Clutter free?** Keep interior and exterior areas free of clutter. Clutter can be a fire hazard or cause injuries in a fall.
- **Info tubes, please.** HOA rules require you to have an info tube by your mailbox. If you need help, contact the Board.
- **Mail security.** Use caution when putting out important mail for pickup; use drop off box in front of clubhouse, instead.


Hours:
