

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL By Jane Recht

Hi everyone, I hope you had a great Easter or Passover. Did April showers bring you May flowers, or just a continuation of a neverending healthy crop of weeds?

I know at my house the battle is on. Just keep consistent and try to win the weed battle as this is going to be a difficult year. There are many weed killer formulas out on the internet. Try using one of the homemade weed mixtures. The easiest is 1 gallon vinegar with a ¼ cup of dish soap mixed in a sprayer. (Notice no salt is added and the vinegar is not diluted with water.)

Salt, when added to the mix, tends to stay in the soil and prevents all plants from regrowing. So be careful how you spray. The overspray will kill healthy plants. The soap functions as a surfactant, enabling the vinegar to adhere effectively to the plant. Vinegar contains acetic acid, which breaks down cell walls and strips moisture from the weed/plant.

I want to thank those who respond to the Curbside Notices and thank you for helping to keep GKA in top form. I would also like to thank my Committee team members, Don Fortney, Marlene Phelps and Hilary Wiley for the great job they are doing.

AMERICAN FLAG ETIQUETTE By Frank Lippman

How to Display the American Flag

According to the recommendations in the U.S. Code, (*4 U.S. Code* § 8 - *Respect for flag*) the American Flag should be displayed with respect and care.

• The Flag should not be flown with the union down (except for in rare emergencies as a sign of distress).

• The Flag should not touch the ground, floor, water, merchandise or anything beneath it.

• The Flag should never be carried flat or horizontally but always aloft and free.

•The Flag should not be dipped to any person or thing.

How to Respectfully Use the American Flag

American Flag coffee cups, sweatshirts and curtains are not patriotic; on the contrary, U.S. Code considers these to be disrespectful toward the Flag:

• The Flag should never be worn as apparel or used as bedding, curtains or covering for a ceiling.

• The Flag should not be used for advertising purposes. For example, the Flag should not be embroidered or printed on cushions, napkins, boxes or anything else that is discarded after temporary use. Advertisement posters should not be attached to a flagpole.

• The Flag should never have words, designs or any other mark drawn or attached to it. It is not respectful to "get creative" and make new art from a US Flag.

• The Flag should not be used as a costume or athletic uniform.

• The Flag should not be used for delivering, carrying or receiving something.

How to Respectfully Retire an American Flag

When the flag becomes old and/or torn or tattered, take the flag to a fire station for proper disposal. In Murrieta, Fire Station #1 at 41825 Juniper Street accepts flags for the proper disposal ceremony. If you cannot take it to the fire station, call Jo at 951-973-4430 (leave a message if necessary). She will

come pick your flag up and take it to the fire station on your behalf.

All residents are required to attend a New Resident Orientation within 30 days of close of escrow. This applies to renters too! EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM By Mick Herod



Did you feel the 5.2 earthquake near Julian on April 14? It was along the Elsinore Fault Zone which runs south from Glen Ivy, through Lake Elsinore, Murrieta and Temecula and ends just south of Julian. While we don't live near the "Big Daddy" San Andreas fault, it can definitely influence other faults nearby.

www.ready.gov/kit is a great place to find a emergency checklist for your "go bag," which you can "grab and go" for rapid evacuation.

A few of the essentials you should be adding to your "go bag" include the following types of items to self-sustain for up to three days:

Flashlight with extra batteries (power might be out)

Food (Survival or protein bars work well)

Water (1 gal. per person per day)

Personal Toiletries

Cell phone, charger and battery bank

First Aid supplies

Radio (battery or crank)

Pen and notepad

Emergency Plan (out-of-state contacts)



May Day (May 1) is a mostly European celebration and may include a dance around the *Maypole*. In some cultures it signifies the arrival of Spring, as it occurs halfway between the Vernal Equinox and the Summer Solstice. There are other theories of its origin, dating back to the 14th century.

Mayday (one word) has no connection to the celebration above. It's an international distress signal for aircraft or watercraft. Typically repeated three times (so as to avoid confusion), it signifies that a life-threatening emergency is imminent or in progress. In aviation it notifies air traffic control to clear the airspace and prioritize the flight for navigation or landing. For watercraft it notifies the Coast Guard and all nearby ships of a developing emergency.

The word *Mayday* originated in the early 1920s and was created by Fredrick Mockford, a radio officer in London. It comes from the French phrase "*m'aider*," meaning "*help me*." A less-than-urgent radio call is *Pan-Pan*, short for "possible assistance needed."

SUMMER VISITORS

Our area hosts several different species of migratory birds throughout Spring and early Summer. Some of the more colorful birds include (from left to right in the images) the Bluebird, Hooded Oriole Western and Western Scrub Jay. NEW 15/215 NOTRHBOUND INTERCHANGE OPENS



After two years of construction, the new 15/215 northbound interchange is finally opening! What might be news to some is the fact that <u>both</u> northbound on-ramps at Winchester Road will allow access to not just the 15 but also the 215. Once you enter <u>either</u> of the Winchester northbound on -ramps, you will need to make a choice—use either the left lane to merge onto the 215 or the right lane for the 15 (using the flyover at far right). For the 15, you'll go "up and over" the 215 and won't be merging onto the main lanes of the15 until just before Murrieta Hot Springs Road.

Notice the solid barrier between the main lanes of the 15 and 215? Drivers on the 15 wanting to transition to the 215 will need to merge onto the 215 <u>before</u> passing the solid barrier. Otherwise, they'll be staying on the 15 and will have to exit to change freeways at Murrieta Hot Springs Road on-ramps. Be aware, as drivers will need to become accustomed to the new traffic patterns.




