- ADA compliance issues are in the forefront and a team is working on implementing our plan.

iolations: there were 3 violations reported in December; one involved an underage person living on a property and 2 dealt with excessive noise. The owners were advised in writing about the issues and given a timeline to clear the issue.

<u>Collections</u>: We ended the year 2022 with 3 accounts in collection. One account is in the foreclosure process; one account is on a payment plan and the last account is with HUD and I've been communicating with them regarding their preforeclosure process. I fully expect February to see several more accounts placed in collections which means follow-up letters will be sent and phone calls will be made.

<u>Treasury:</u> We finished our fiscal year 2022 with \$100.00 remaining in budget. Considering the difficult year of unexpected increases, that's a grand number and I'm proud of our Directors for working hard to accomplish so much with less dollars to spend.

The ACCOUNTS RECEIVABLE balance as of December 31st is \$15,982. This number includes long-term collection accounts on which liens have been filed, unpaid fines in the amount of \$4,061 and 1 delinquent account for \$142.00.

DUMPSTER - Our 6-yard dumpster at the back end of our Facilities Parking Lo is very popular. It is emptied each Tuesday at 10:30 AM; it tends to fill quickly, s come best as you can. The front portion naturally fills up first, - yet, much mor can fit in if you place flat cardboard towards the rear of the dumpster. Recently we have had individuals place garbage outside the dumpster which was locked meaning FULL TO CAPACITY. This type of behavior must stop immediately The Waste Management driver is in no position to get out of the truck, move exterior transit, prior to dumping. We installed a high-resolution camera behind the dumpster elevated to record all persons approaching the dumpster. We utilize this asset to identify the person committing this violation. The camera is able to clearly show the person's face and vehicle license plate. When we establish identity and home address, we print off the pictures, include a cover letter stating the violation and approach the resident. Contact goes as a warning. offense may result in a fine of \$65.00, the cost of a second service to empty the dumpster. Please refrain from placing any form of trash outside the confines of ou dumpster. Simply return home; return Tuesday to an open, empty dumpster. You cooperation is much appreciated.

<u>HAVEN</u> – We offer four types of medical assistance equipment to our residents in their time of need, - wheelchair, walker, crutches, and cane. You are welcome to utilize any item for as long as needed. When no longer needed simply call (925) 286-0679 to arrange a return to the *HAVEN ROOM*.

<u>BULK ITEMS</u> – Twice a year, you can set to the curb, up to six large bulky items Please contact *Waste Management* at 1-(800) 423-9956; give them a brief description of the items; stack the items on the curb by 6:00 AM; day of service Thursday.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL COMMITTEE - MAURICE CAMP

Department conducting fire inspections in GOLF KNOLLS. I also stated in did not know facts at that time but I would research to find out what I could I did my research and reached out to the Fire Chief of Murrieta, Fire Chief MELLOY; he was very cooperative with information. The Fire Department has issued citations for palm trees that are untrimmed, shrubbery overgrown, etc. CHIEF MELLOY advised GOLF KNOLLS ASSOCIATION is in a "high fire hazard zone" and the Fire Department will pay close attention. I stressed to him our situation of how dangerous fire is to our community and he more than agreed.

A.C.C. (Continued)

The Fire Department conducts inspections periodically in all "high fire hazard zones" such as ours, so for those of you who have palm trees, don't wait until the Fire Department comes calling, get them trimmed now. The ACC will also be on the lookout.

I inquired about a rumor I heard about Fire Department inspections upon the sale of your homes. CHIEF MELLOY stated three years ago, the Federal Government came down on all Fire Departments to have inspections upon sale of homes in "fire hazard areas". This is a law the Real Estate people ignore; however it will be enforced starting this year. The Escrow Company will not or should not close until they receive a "NOTE OF COMPLIANCE" from the Fire Department. GOLF KNOLLS ASSOCIATION will be requiring this compliance as well.

CHIEF MELLOY gave me the contact information for the person in charge of all procedures in our area. I have reached out but no reply at this time. I am sure he will be getting back to me and I can have more information and pass it on to you.

From what CHIEF MELLOY indicated to me, a five-foot clearance around the house is mandatory, no overhanging trees, no vines growing up the walls of the home, etc. He stated they will come to one of our meetings if we request, so maybe the new Board will invite the Fire Department in 2023.

GOLF KNOLLS EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM - MICK HEROD, CO-CHAIRMAN

he *Emergency Response Team* is off to a great start in 2023. We are in the process of ordering over \$1,700 in new emergency supplies and equipment that will be utilized anytime there is a unit-wide emergency within GOLF KNOLLS. We have three new *Block Captains* that have been recently assigned, so we're getting closer to having every neighborhood represented. There are just over 100 homes without a designated *Block Captain*. If we can get just five or six more volunteers willing to assign and coordinate neighborhood teams to check on twenty or so residences following an emergency we will be able to celebrate 100% coverage.

We urgently need Block Captains in the following neighborhoods:

Call Alta (West half of street, up to Via Zapata)

Via Ventosa (entire cul-de-sac)

Via Taffia (Southwest end) and Fuente Court

Calle Cisne (both sides)

Calle del Buho (Northwest end)

Calle Cervato (West side)

Calle Potro (both sides

Via Oruga (entire cul-de-sac)

Even if you don't live in, but are close to these neighborhoods, your assistance will greatly help keep our community safe. Unless there's an emergency, we only meet once a month (usually about an hour), both in the daytime and evening, on two consecutive days (you choose which meeting to attend).

EMERGENCY RESPONSE (Continued)

To become a **Block Captain** requires a willing spirit and about an hour of initial training. Afterward, each **Block Captain** will receive a two-way radio, allowing instant communication between other **Block Captains**, **Tent Captains** and our **Emergency Operations Center** (at the Recreation Area).

In California, we live with a constant threat of earthquakes, though we can also be affected by fires or floods. That's when the *Emergency Response Team* springs into action to help and protect our neighbors. Experts, as well as local officials, tell us that during an area-wide emergency, we may need to be self-sufficient for up to 72 hours before rescue personnel may reach our community.

Please consider joining our team of 30+ volunteers and keep GOLF KNOLLS

safe.

SCHEMES, SCAMS, AND FLIM-FLAM — SCHEMES, SCAMS, AND FLIM-FLAM — 'Love is gentle, love is kind...' but not for many con artists. With Valentine's Day approaching, young and old searching for love are targets for scams during this time. The criminals are masters in manipulating human emotion and target seniors when their defenses are down. For many con artists this is the prime season to hunt down and attract a gullible heart while in pursuit of the materialistic and financial goodies that come along with it. The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) said that romance related scams have surged and generated more losses than any other consumer fraud reported to the agency. There are more than 40 million registered members of online dating clubs and services and more than 50% of the members are seniors. Newspapers and major magazines feature lonely-hearts section in the classified ads making it easy for scam artists to target seniors.

Many con artists have impressive backgrounds, and the appearance of wealth. Some are 100% liars about everything they say, while others blend a smooth mixture of truth and lies. They pride themselves on their ability to charm, manipulate, and win one's confidence and may woo and dollar pinch their victims for several years before they vanish. Many instances occur through the hands of someone who is the health-care provider for the elderly person. Many home-aid workers target and become companions to homebound and bedridden seniors by winning the vulnerable elderly person's love and trust, handling their business affairs, isolating them from family and friends. Not satisfied with merely taking their victims for everything they have, a few actually murder their victims by using various medications or by starving them to death.

SCAMS (Continued)

The victims of sweetheart scams are often selected as potential prey when the con artist is aware that they recently retired with a good retirement package, were recently widowed or suspected of coming into a large life-insurance benefit Highly religious people are especially vulnerable because con artists realize that all they have to do is put up a good pious sham and the rest is a blessing.

Potential victims are first approached in various ways and depends on the cor artist's choice of roles. Some read the obituary columns and attend funerals to become acquainted with the wealthy grieving person. After a con artist gets his intended prey to start talking the game begins. They will do and say whatever they believe the victim wants to see or hear.

Cases are hard to prove because the victim consented to everything that happened to them. However, should the victim be able to present proof that the con artist intentionally defrauded them, then a prosecutor could be used. Although romance-related scams have been around for ages, they have become more common and successful as people spend more time socializing and finding dates or line.

• RECALL - TAKATA Airbag Inflators are the reason for 42,000 VOLKSWAGEN BEETLES being recalled. The recall covers Beetles from the 2015 and 2016 model years. The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) said that the inflators can explode with too much force and hurl shrapnel. Dealers will replace the driver's airbag in the Beetles. Owners will be notified by letter starting February 17.

• HAVE YOU RECEIVED THE MIDDLE CLASS TAX REFUND? The Franchise Tax Board reported it has sent nearly 9.5 billion dollars to taxpayers by direct deposit and nearly 18 million dollars in debit cards issued to qualifying taxpayers for the Middle Class Tax Refund (MCTR)—Recipients must be California residents and tax filers in order to qualify. Payments and their amounts are based on tax returns filed for 2020 (not 2021) because many of those late filers are still being processed. If money is owed in 2021, payment will come later in the MCTR distribution cycle. If you have trouble with your MCTR debit card, such as errors, of if the card or PIN has been lost, stolen or used without your permission, call Customer Service at 800-240-0223; the state has set up a page at ftb.ca.gov where residents can check eligibility and how much they will receive.
