ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL REPORT By Jane Recht

Hi everyone. Don't you love our fall weather with cool nights and crisp mornings? If you're a vegetable gardener, you should have put your winter vegetables in about 2 weeks ago. That would include lettuce, beets, peas, radish, cabbage, onions, garlic, leeks, artichokes, and other winter or cool season crops.

Winter is the time to do the major pruning of our landscape plants. I wait until the leaves start to fall on my deciduous trees and shrubs to vigorously prune. Winter pruning allows you to shape and size plants, minimizing the stress or shock to the plant. It also encourages healthy growth and promotes better air circulation that reduces the risk of fungal diseases.

The ACC is hoping you will take the time and look at your trees and shrubs. Please prune and make sure your plants remain on your property, off the neighbor's property, and not extending into the roads. We get lots of complaints from GKA residents who do not want to clean the leaves and debris associated with plants that are not theirs.

Keep your thumbs green and enjoy the season. Before you know it, we will all be busy with the holiday season. Gardening is a way of showing you believe in tomorrow. It reflects hope, patience, and a promise of better things to come.

FACILITIES By Don Fortney

Four salt cells were installed in late September, initiating the salt chlorination system to our pool and spas. Refined salt was added to all three bodies of water, starting the process of converting salty water to chlorine. Properly managed, algae is eliminated, which results in clear, soft water, around the clock.

Two brand-new sets of washers and dryers were delivered in early October. These machines are state-of-the-art, with one set in classic large load size, the other set king size load, 30lb. capacity. All four machines are numbered for easy recognition, and equipped with debit/credit card readers. An easy-to-use phone app, Wash Connect, is available to download, assisted by easy-to-follow signs mounted on the wall.

The old library in building #2 is scheduled for demolition on October 27th, with a 4-day time frame to complete. Details include removal of the raised floor and metal railings, widening of the hallway to bathrooms and converting the existing first bathroom for ADA compliance. Lastly, the non-working, wall-mounted drinking fountain will be removed.

Over in the Banquet Room, existing bathrooms #3 & #4 are being converted to ADA compliance. Details include new leverstyle door handles, partition walls reduced or removed, and sink p-traps wrapped for safety. Bathroom #3 is slated to be repainted in the color of the Banquet Room walls.

Repairing the indoor spa is a work in progress due to the severity of leaks detected. Repair details include demolition to the spas concrete perimeter, based on the inability to isolate the exact location of the leaks. Working on the spa will commence once we are satisfied with the salt chlorination process recently installed to all three pools. Comments of water clarity, temperature and soft skin after a swim will soon be commonplace.



2026 HOA BOARD ELECTION By Mick Herod, Inspector of Elections

There will be NO balloting this year for the 2026 HOA Board. As was the case last year, whenever the number of vetted nominees is equal to or less than the number of openings, no balloting is required. This is considered an uncontested election. The Board simply appoints the nominees by a process called acclamation.

In this election cycle, there are four openings on our HOA Board for 2026, due to their (two-year) term limits expiring in January. The By-Laws state that Board members "terming out" are eligible for a second two-year term if they so choose. After a total of four consecutive years served, they must take at least a one-year hiatus from the Board.

The four current members terming out are Jerry Dyer, Vicki Davis, Frank Lippman and Judy Kirkpatrick. Excluding Vicki Davis, the other three tendered their nominations for 2026 and were subsequently vetted. These three, and one to be later named by the Board, will be added by acclamation to the 2026 Board after the (open) Annual Meeting, scheduled for Monday, January 12, 2026.

The following day, the new Board will conduct an open meeting and individual positions will be determined by the new Board. If any position is contested by two or more Board members, a secret vote by the Board will be conducted to determine the outcome, administered by the Inspector of Elections.

The 2026 Board members and their respective positions will be announced following the Tuesday meeting.

Take advantage of a FREE drop-off location for ABOP—that's Antifreeze, Batteries (auto or household), Oil (and filters) plus Paint (latex and oil-based). Note that these items cannot be disposed of in your household trash.

Riverside County operates the ABOP program every non-holiday Saturday from 9am to 2pm. The facility is located in the County Yard on Jefferson Rd, just north of Murr. Hot Springs Rd. You don't even need to get out of your car...just show your ID* and open your trunk. Employees will handle your waste.

More road construction will be taking place on Murrieta Hot Springs Rd. There will be a new right-hand turn pocket leading into the Sam's Club shopping center at Alta Murrieta Dr., adjacent to the Shell gas station.

Included in this project is pavement overlay from Alta Murrieta to I-15.

No specific start date is mentioned, but a project sign is posted near the future location of the turn pocket.

CANADA GEESE RETURN By Beth Harvy

Those of us who are lucky to live along the golf course have noticed that the Canada Geese are returning. The geese are beautiful, intelligent birds and they can bond with humans, particularly through imprinting in goslings or through positive interactions like regular feeding and gentle care for adult geese. Geese are social animals that recognize individuals, and a person who consistently provides food or a gentle presence may be approached with less fear and develop a trusting relationship with the geese.

If you want to feed them, provide;

Grains like oats

Corn

Wheat

Leafy greens such as lettuce, kale, and dandelion greens

Vegetables like peas, carrots, and cucumbers

Offer these foods on the ground; avoid throwing them into the water. While geese will eat berries and some insects, never feed them bread, moldy food, or toxic items as these are unhealthy for them.

Feeding them bread, moldy food or toxic items causes "Angel wing." In a Canada Goose this refers to a permanent wing deformity caused by a poor diet, typically human-provided bread and crackers, which results in the wing joint twisting outward, making flight impossible. The condition is caused by the fast-growing primary flight feathers straining the developing wrist joint. While early intervention with wrapping the wing to support the developing bones can sometimes correct it, adult geese with angel wing are permanently unable to fly.

So, enjoy these beautiful babies and if you choose to feed them, please consider the healthy list above.

LOOKING UP IN NOVEMBER

The first full moon of the month, the Beaver Moon, is so named because beavers build their dams during this time of year. It is yet another Supermoon, which will occur on Monday, November 5. Moonrise is at 6:09pm.

What's a Supermoon? That's when the Moon appears larger and brighter than regular full moons because the Moon is at its closest point to Earth. This is one of eight Supermoons in 2025, with the next one occurring on December 4th.

You'll have another chance to see a meteor shower this month, on November 17/18 (Leonids) with up to 15 meteors per hour. The moon will only be 5% full so, clouds notwithstanding, it should be a good night to view. Look to the south.

Now, if you really want to see a meteor shower, your best chance is THE biggest shower of the year, the Geminids, overnight on December 13. Peak counts are 75 meteors per hour. Plus, it gets dark early and you won't have to stay up into the wee hours to see the king of the meteor showers. The moon will be about 30% full, allowing you to see all but the faintest meteors. You can begin looking as early as 8pm.

Some possible viewing spots with darker skies can be found between Temecula and Hemet (off Winchester Rd.) or perhaps around Lake Skinner or Vail Lake. Take your RV or trailer and enjoy!


