Meanwhile, my other handyman/contractor BRIAN HOWITT, in mid April, had surgery. He is on the mend, can return to light duty early in June.

Without options, the *Handicap* stall in the Men's Outdoor Bathroom by the Spa, remains incomplete in its repair/replace project. Have no fear; we will forge forward in our pursuit of refurbished bathhouse in months ahead.

UPDATE – Handicap stall in Men's Room has been removed and new valve and plumbing installed. Replacing 3 walls with tiles remains to be done. Meanwhile, painting and patching of walls took place June 9th and 10th; looks great. The final topcoat of epoxy flooring was done on June 19th. Due to curing the topcoat for longevity, removal and replacement of countertops, sinks and commodes, the bathroom remained locked until June 27th. Alternative bathrooms were used in the library lobby and the card room. Outdoor Spa remains unheated as we have yet to reach 77°F ambient (outdoors) temperature consistently.

GOLF KNOLLS EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM - MICK HEROD, CO-CHAIRMAN

he ERT conducted Neighborhood Gatherings/Block Parties on June 3rd in several neighborhoods. Hopefully, you had an opportunity to attend at Meet Your Block or Tent Captain. We were not able to do this for every neighborhood yet, as we're still in need of a few good individuals or couples to act as Block Captains. Most months we only ask for a one-hour commitment to attend ERT meetings, so please consider it.

In addition to our annual budget, we have been collecting income from CRV can and bottle recycling. Year-to-date CRV income is up to \$475, with adds to our available funds. Your efforts in collecting and delivering recyclable bottles and cans are much appreciated. Remember, sort bottles and cans into separate bags when possible and put any glass into your own trash cans (glass does not generate as much income and broken glass is a major safety hazard).

ERT funds being spent as frugally as possible. Some recent purchases include a 100-pound propane tank (to fuel the large emergency generator at the Recreation Area), mobile trauma kits, Bleed Stop kits, a fifth First Aid tent, bulk propane tanks to allow light and heat for each tent, additional two-way radios, extra batteries, splints and other First Aid items. These are all items intended to assist residents in case of an area-wide emergency. Of course, we hope we never have to use these items, but we will be prepared when necessary.

- SCHEMES, SCAMS, AND FLIM-FLAM Thieves are always looking for new ways to take your dollars. They have reached into the pockets of victims via phone calls, text messages, emails, social media and in person. The scammers have become masters of human psychology. Their message creates a sense of urgency for the victim to act quickly and to try to respond by clicking on a link or call a number. Victims lost over 3.5 billion to cyber criminals in the first half of 2022.

According to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC), there were more than 150,000 reports of bank-related identity fraud. The victim receives a text from his/her bank asking if he/she tried to send money via Zelle, Cash App, or Venmo (which is the same as handing the thief cash.) The victim promptly responds "NO" - within seconds, the phone rings and the caller I.D. shows his/her bank's name including "Fraud Protection". The scammer's instruction is to transfer his/her savings to a new secure account. Result – loss of life savings to a scam. Be aware of:

- Fake websites that look like an official site.
- Scam phone calls impersonating a bank employee.
- Advance fee fraud claiming eligibility for a loan or 0% interest rate if you pay up front.
- Fake checks and money orders.
- Investment scams using the bank's name to steal.
- Go to the FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION at www.ftc.gov. If you believe you have been scammed, contact the FEDERAL TRADE COMMISSION 1-877-382-4357 (1-877-FTC-HELP), 1-877-438-4338 your attorney general (www.naag.org) and your local police.
