then be approved by the board. The term in office will be for one year, ending in January 2027. This will fulfill the remaining year of Don and Lauras' terms.

Hi everyone. We are sure having some strange weather for winter, but who knows what next week will bring? I respectfully resigned from being your ACC Director and will now serve in my fifth year as GKA Secretary. So, until we can get an ACC Director you can still submit your requests to me.

I want to thank Hilary Wylie, Marlene Phelps and Don Fortney for their help on the team that reviews our homes. I would also like to thank Vicki Davis, sub-chairman, Marlene Phelps, Glenda Smith, and Pam Byers for overseeing and reviewing the Paint Committee. A big thanks to all the residents who do such a great job keeping up their properties at GKA and those who made the improvements to comply with the ACC requests.

Now, Secretary stuff. Every two years the Association is required to conduct an Owner Survey to validate that at least one member of the household is 55 years or older. This is a requirement posed by the State of California to maintain our 55-year-old senior housing designation. That designation helps with our property taxes and allows (in theory) peaceful co-existence with other older folks.

The Owner Survey will be mailed out to all property owners. If the owner's home is income property, then we need to have the renters' names and ages to verify that they too meet the housing requirements. It is also very important to provide emergency contacts on the form.

This year, it is **mandatory** to complete the survey and **submit it within 30 days of receipt or you may be fined**. I wish we had another way to motivate folks but last time it took over 6 months, constant phone calling, and we still only got about 73% of the surveys returned. Thank you for your help to keep us classified as a senior community.


Second step, fill out a ACC FORM with color samples of exterior and trim, then return the form to the office.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

The three icons above show the likely disasters that could befall our community, and have the potential to do property damage and/or bodily injury, with an earthquake being the most likely.

Were you at home on January 19, just before 6pm? If so, did you feel the earthquake? The preliminary magnitude was 5.3, later downgraded to 4.9. The epicenter was northeast of Indio.

While sitting on my couch, my phone sent a very loud siren-type warning (which I've never heard before) and a loud voice said, "Drop, Cover and Hold On.". Reaching for my phone, the screen showed "Earthquake Detected" and icons of the audible words.

I sat there looking puzzled for about five seconds until I started to feel the shaking (which was mild and lasted less than a second).

I was pleasantly surprised to know that the broadcast gave such a "heads-up" for the coming quake. Of course, this one being near Palm Springs, I would guess that residents there had a much smaller warning window—but those precious seconds could mean the difference between life and serious injuries, if you start taking cover as soon as the alert sounds.

I do not remember specifically enabling these alerts from the USGS, but it appears they may have been automatically enabled via Android software. And yes, though many have iPhones, it's quite easy to check if these notifications are allowed on either device.

ANDROID PHONES:

Go to 'Notifications,' which is usually accessed via the 'gear' icon.

In 'Notifications' screen, scroll down and select 'Advanced Settings.'

Select 'Wireless Emergency Alerts'.

Allow alerts by sliding the buttons to the right for each type of alert you want to enable.

When finished, return to the Home screen.

iPhones


Go to 'Notifications,' which is usually accessed via the 'gear' or 'settings' icon.

Under 'Government Alerts,' enable 'Emergency Alerts.'

Under 'Emergency Alerts,' slide the buttons to the right for each type of alert you want to enable.

When finished, return to the Home screen.

These are the most common instructions, but your software version may be slightly different. But if done correctly, you will now be ready to receive official alerts on your phone. (If not, ask the grandkids!).




