Have you thought about what happens when, as a member of GKA, you have outstanding fines for violations of the GKA rules and regulations?

You lose your rights to use and to be on the common property of GKA, period! That means your fobs are deactivated and you have no access to our facility until the fines are paid. You cannot be a guest of another resident, nor shall anyone loan their fob to you or let you on the property. If you continue to gain access, somehow, to the GKA facility, you can and will be trespassed. [Ed. Note: According to Google, trespassed means "being legally ordered to leave a property and not return by the property owner or someone authority, potentially facing consequences if you violate the order."] Also, you are not allowed to attend social functions at the facility. The only two exceptions are (1) on Fridays when the office is open, you can be allowed to go in via the gate on Camino Alba (hopefully to pay your fine) and (2) to attend the monthly HOA meetings. Please pay your fines.

All new owners and renters here at GKA are required to attend orientation prior to getting use of our facility. Please contact Steve Phelps by phone at 760-214-3553, email at smokymtntwo@hotmail.com or Marlene Phelps at 760-14-3552, to schedule an appointment.

To owners of rental properties within GKA, all renters must have a tenant survey and a copy of a picture I.D. on file at the GKA office. Also, for owners living outside of GKA, we need a current mailing address and current phone number on file. Renters, if you could supply us with your landlord's information that would be of help.

FACILITIES MANAGER, 2.0 By Don Fortney

The new Library recently had new custom shelves installed for puzzles, fitting the same design and stain as the bookshelves, except deeper. We also had installed a new single-depth, 4-shelf, bookshelf that runs the 13ft along the window wall facing the pool. The height is just 4ft tall, allowing tons of sunlight to fill this beautiful new addition to this very popular Library. A final touch was added when a cost-saving, one hour lighting timer was installed, preventing the lights from staying on all day or night.

In the Banquet Room, new cabinets were installed below the new coffee bar and new service counter, located in the rear of the room. They have a fresh coat of high-gloss, washable white paint, giving them a clean, crisp appearance. See the photo on Page 7

Plans for the Banquet Room include the replacement of its dated collection of ceiling chandeliers for the more modern, cost-effective LED can lights. They run on much less amperage than regular lightbulbs and eliminate dark areas.

In the Banquet Room we will also be relocating some on/off electrical switches controlling the overhead lights and ceiling fans from the rear of the room to the double doors at the front, making unlocking and locking the room much more convenient for event organizers.

Over in the Meeting Room, we mounted a new 85" smart TV on the wall behind the HOA board dais (see the photo on Page 7). Also recently completed, the new sign-in/dessert countertop table, with matching floor-to-ceiling bookshelves for forms, Newsletters, flyers, information materials, etc. Clark Baldwin spent countless hours meticulously installing, caulking, painting and building the support legs from scratch out of his garage. It is so well built, it surely will stand the test of time. These upgrades and remodels were way overdue; now they're here for all to enjoy. Say hello to any member of "Team Don" and make their day.

ARCHITECTURAL CONTROL By Jane Recht

Happy Spring

Did you know the rabbit is the symbol for spring? The rabbit represents fertility and renewal to the earth. Spring also brings an abundance of quick plant growth especially for yard weeds. I know my yard has already had many weed removal sessions this year. So, as I weed my yard, I look for the positive like all the Vitamin D that my skin will absorb because of being outside enjoying the sun and weeding.

This accelerated growth of our plants brings me to focus on our Architectural Control Committee duties. When the ACC members view the front your house, we are looking for a couple things. They include all shrubs needing to be pruned to less than 3 feet, trees not escaping your property boundaries, trash cans stored out of view, and that you are presenting a well-groomed, tidy house lot.

The steps that ACC uses to notify start with an inspection done from the street in a golf cart with two ACC members. If your home needs a tune up, then the Curbside Notification form is left for you in your tube. If you are a renter a copy is made of the form that has been left in your tube and the owner will also receive a copy via US mail. This gives you 30 days to take care of the landscape or hardscape issue.

The ACC members return in 3 weeks. They view your property and if the notification has been corrected you get a thank you card. If the issue has not been addressed, you get a reminder Curbside Inspection form. Approximately 30 days later we view the property one last time. If corrected, you get the thank you or you will get a letter via US mail notifying you that the correction has not been completed and the issue will going into the fine process.

You can appeal any ACC decision or if needed, get a time extension. Our goal is to keep GKA beautiful. Our house values are appreciating, and in some cases you reduce the fire threat for yourself and your neighbors. So please help us by helping yourselves. Summer is coming, so let's get a jump on this years landscape and house painting.



EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM By Mick Herod










COSTCO EMAL SCAMS By Mick Herod

Somewhere, somehow, scammers have found my email address and are trying to get me to take the bait. I'll show you how to easily spot a scam. Reference the bogus email on the facing page:

First, the scammer is trying to get you to take "immediate action." (1)

Look at the sender's email address: newsletter@zequen.pro (2)

This is your second line of defense. If it was legit, it would be from something like *Costco.com*.



Hover your mouse (but don't click) (3) wherever you're instructed to click. You'll get a small popup window (4) that shows you the actual website you'd be loading (again, *zequen.pro*). This is your third line of defense.

Now, what happens if you click the link shown above? Not predictable, but in this case, as an example, I clicked on the link and here's what I saw (an advertisement).




You may have been directed to a (likely) harmless advertisement that had nothing to do with Costco, Keurig or zequen.pro. Or, you might have just collected a virus on your computer.

Back to the original email, there is at least one more red flag at the bottom of the email. Note the two paragraphs (5) of pure gibberish, having nothing to do with the rest of the email.

This is about the fifth such similar "Costco giveaway" that I've received in February and early March. The best way to defeat the scammers is to DELETE the email and (if you can) BLOCK the SENDER. DO NOT use any Unsubscribe links. Why? Because once you do, your email address becomes a legitimate, verified address which the scammers can then sell to other scammers.

Once you've blocked the scammers, the emails will, in time, go away.

Yes, the emulsion held together better than the previous batch, which had separated slightly after sitting too long before 4:00 PM, likely because the oil had not been drizzled slowly enough while mixing. By 2:55 PM, the cheese platter had already been arranged, but because the crackers had absorbed some humidity after 10:40 AM, they lacked the usual crispness, though nobody seemed particularly bothered by the change in texture. However, before 9:05 am, the yogurt had been strained properly, making the consistency much thicker than usual, though it was noted that the honey, having been stored near the stove before 3:20 pm, had thinned out too much, causing it to drizzle too quickly. Because the soup had been stirred thoroughly before 6:30 PM, there was no risk of ingredients settling unevenly, though the broth, which had been reduced significantly after 8:15AM, carried a slightly saltier flavor than anticipated. However, because the salad had been dressed just before 7:50 PM, the greens remained crisp, unlike the previous attempt, which had wilted slightly after being tossed too early around 4:25 PM.

Around 11:05 AM.

the dough had risen sufficiently, though it was noted that the yeast had been activated a little later than usual before 8:55 AM, making the fermentation process slightly longer. Still, because the baking had started promptly after 1:20PM, the final result carried a perfect crust, despite the minor delay earlier in the process. Although the flavors had balanced well by 9:40 PM, there was a slight note of bitterness in the sauce, possibly due to the way the




