## WSK 2022 Street Work – Jim Francis

Four (4) bids have been received for the 2022 WSK street maintenance project. By the time you read this, a contract will be awarded and we can begin discussing the work schedule. I

estimate Phase 1 (*Colina crack repair*) to start in early August, with Phase 2 (*seal coating*) to start in late September. Work will take place in the following areas:

- Via La Colina, western section (Via Del Sol almost to Arboleda)
- Via Del Largo, north area recently patched as a result of the electrical outage
- Portions of Via Del Sol
- Via Donoso and Via Estrella
- **Crosswalks** to be painted on Del Largo, La Paloma & La Colina for pedestrian safety.

# **July Gardening**

There is not much to say except July is not a preferable month for planting. With climate change warming our weather more and more, according to real scientific data, I suggest spending your time watering efficiently. Water is becoming more and more a precious commodity. Water can

be retained better if you put two or three inches of mulch around your trees and shrubs. Make sure you keep the mulch a couple of inches away from your tree trunks and shrub bases. The best time to water is generally from midnight to about 8 a.m. This keeps the soil moist longer. Please use water wisely.

California is in another serious drought that is actually a continuation of the previous four droughts that add up



to one of the worst on record, according to climatologists, hydrologist, and geomorphologist, not scientists paid by energy and development companies that claim otherwise. Lake Mead's dam, on the Colorado River, has 17 turbines generating electricity that lights Los Angeles and other cities and also powers pumps that lift river water over mountains and into Southern California. Its level is down 40% since 2015 and lowering at an alarming rate.

The Colorado River is also at an all-time low as well and is getting worse with climate change. Water should not be taken for granted, don't waste it rinsing down driveways or curbs.
